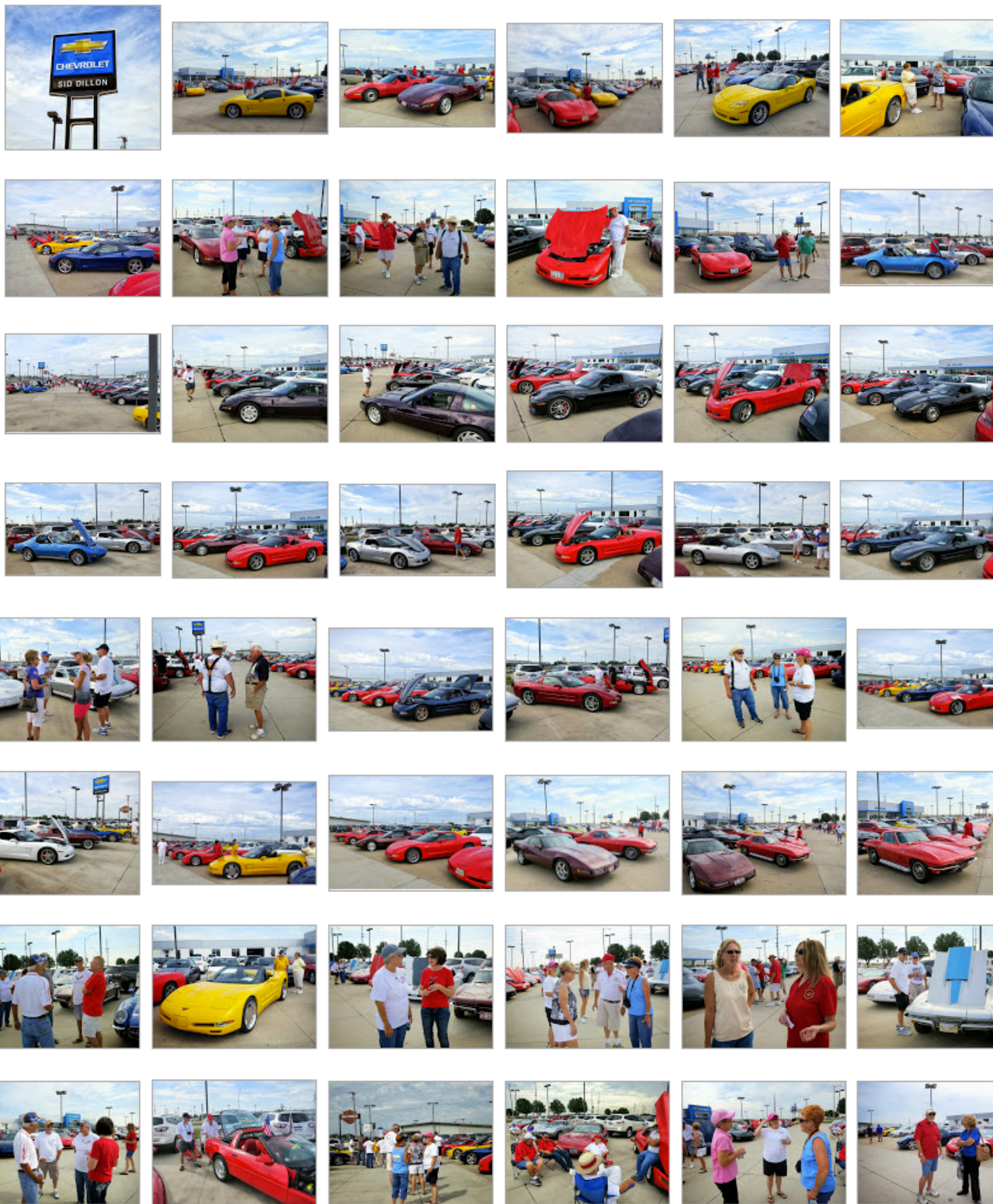

Kevin Reit, Vice President led members in the *Pledge of Allegiance*. He thanked those who donated door prizes, encouraged members to purchase raffle tickets, asked guests to be introduced and announced "Gene Fisher is in the house". Congratulations went out to Jim Walton on his retirement. Kevin reminded members about the Harchelroad Motors Open House in Imperial, NE on 10/12/13 and provided the phone number of the Imperial Inn (308-882-4880) for those wanting to book rooms.

Marie Manz, Membership Director introduced four new members who received the CCC raise and clap welcome. The members with August birthdays were announced for the birthday drawing. Marie reported membership renewals will be in the mail the second week of October and will include a stamped reply envelope.

Pattie Bena, Secretary received a motion to accept the July minutes from Cheryl Sondy with a second from Al Jankowski. Pattie displayed a sample of a visor embroidered with our club name. George Horst modeled a red cap with flames and club logo. These items can be ordered and are available in various colors. Visors sell for \$13 and caps \$18. She reminded members of the 12 item minimum for embroidered items and encouraged anyone wanting a club shirt, visor or hat to order tonight for delivery at the next meeting. The final order of Summer Festival shirts is ready for pick up tonight.

Pam and Mark DeLong, Social Directors gave a recap of recent events including the Louisville Car Show, Vettes on the Rockies and Gregg Young Car Show. Mark displayed the second place trophy the club won at the Gretna Parade. Details were announced for upcoming socials:

Randy Williams was congratulated for having the autocross FTD at Vettes on the Rockies.

Cindy Kohlscheen, Editor & Webmaster was not present to make a report.

Tom Horeis, Treasurer gave the financial report. He announced we were short tonight in reaching the 35 meal minimum and encouraged more members to join us for dinner prior to the meeting since the free banquet room is based on meals purchased.

Bob Speckmann, Public Relations reported a great turnout of 37 Corvettes at the Gregg Young Car Show and attributed part of the success to the ad in the World Herald. Thanks went out to Chris Nightser for his help with this event. Bob encouraged participation in the Fremont Sid Dillon Car show on 9/7; a nice lunch is provided. Bob announced he stopped by Advance on West Maple and it looks like they will become a contributor and help with SF door prizes. Bob gave a sincere thank you for the Club's 2012 1st place NCCC trophy.

Gary Brisbois, Governor reported he will attend the national meeting in St. Louis on 9/13. Gary explained how to use the NCCC data base to obtain West Region points information. JB Benedict can also be contacted for points information. Gary announced there is no decision yet on the Rule Book changes concerning class changes or 1/8 mile drags.

Don Angerth, Competition Director announced upcoming competition events: 8/17-18 low speed events at Ankeny; IA; 8/24 is low speed at Hawkeye Downs on the oval track; 8/30-9/1 is Summer Festival with autocross, high speed and 1/8 mile drags; 10/5-6 is 1/4mile drags and low speed events at Kearney. He reported 10 sanctions were received from the Topeka club so a low speed weekend is planned for 10/19-20 at Mall of the Bluffs.

Jon Manz, Regional Executive (RE) had no report.

Anita Poss, Summer Festival Director announced tonight is the deadline for early registration, so sign up and save some money. Tech will be Friday 8/30 at Gau's from 5 to 7 p.m. and Anita stressed how much it helps to have everyone tech on Friday. There will be an Overall Award, which is on display tonight, for the most points accumulated over the SF weekend. Events chairmen gave a brief recap of the "birthday bash" themed People's Choice Car Show, Funkhana (which is expected to be "just ducky") and Poker Rallye (no way to get lost). Anita reminded everyone that the rules for a Rallye require both a driver and navigator, so those with two cars will need to work something out. Jim Benedict reported he has "the course figured out" for the 1/8 mile drags. There will be instruction given for those new to drag racing after the drivers meeting. CCC will be integrated with the regular drags so we will get to watch other cars as well and expects we will get more than six runs. Gene Gau announced the low speed tech and run times and said no birthday suits allowed. Jerry Koraleski's input for the high speed is "go fast". He will need to verify the time the track opens (in the past it was 7:30) and suggested you review the safety requirements for your class. High speed requires a fire extinguisher and you must have a high speed license. Anita announced there is a high speed practice day at Mid-America Motorplex (MAM) on Tuesday, August 20th for \$50 with a drivers' meeting at 12:30; a high speed license is not required for the practice day as their rules are not as strict as NCCC's and convertibles are allowed. The Birthday Bash Party is Sunday evening at the Stumble Inn ballroom. Social points will be given for attendance at the party. Anita heard some super entertainment will be stopping by plus there will be games, a drawing for great door prizes plus everyone receives a birthday present. There will be a cash bar. Anita asked for a show of hands on preference of food and will send an update with more information.

Kevin Reit, Vice President had no report.

JB Benedict, Points Chairman announced the 3rd Leach Camper Open House is 9/7. Leach provides the use of the RV used for timing at our speed events. Six people are needed to serve hotdogs at the open house; shifts run from 9 a.m. till noon and noon to 3 p.m. JB reported points for convention have not been posted because he needs a list of those registered: 50 CCC points, 15 NCCC points and 5 points for each competition event will be earned. No points are given for day passes. Kathy Brisbois offered to provide the list. JB needs to know who went on to the Black Hills Classic so he can post their points. JB has the points recap on the table. He said there is a posting error in the national software and once it is corrected we will have over double the points of the 2nd place club.

Old Business: Bill Anderson asked if CCC will retain West Region first option for Labor Day weekend after the restriction is lifted three years from now. Gary Brisbois confirmed the CCC governor will retain first option for 2016.

New Business: None

The winner of the birthday drawing was Jake Cartwright.

The winner of the 50/50 Raffle was Jayne "lucky" Reit (\$105 to the winner and \$105 to the National Kidney Foundation). Door prize drawings followed.

Kevin reminded that nominations for 2014 Board of Directors will begin at the September meeting.

Randy Williams made the motion to adjourn with a second by Gary Brisbois.

Did You Know?

One of the Job Description duties of Secretary: The secretary shall prepare and distribute ballots for the annual election of officers, including the distribution of absentee ballots in accord with the ARTICLE III, SECTION 5 of the BY-LAWS.

I want to be sure everyone is aware of our election procedures and your right to vote by absentee ballot should you be unable to attend the November 21st General Meeting. Feel free to provide your stamped, self-addressed envelope at the September or October meeting and I will mail a ballot once nominations are closed after the October meeting. Email requests are also accepted for this purpose.

ARTICLE III of By-Laws

Voting of the Members

SECTION 1. All general members in good standing in attendance at any regular monthly general meeting or special meeting as provided for by the Operating Rules of Procedure, shall constitute a quorum for the transacting of all business at that meeting. A member is in good standing when all dues are paid in full.

SECTION 2. Each eligible member in attendance shall be entitled to one vote.

SECTION 3. A majority of the quorum present at any special meeting or regular meeting may require a secret ballot to be taken on any issue or election which is to be voted on by the membership.

SECTION 4. At both regular meetings and special meetings, unless otherwise specified herein, a majority vote of the quorum present shall be necessary to determine issues voted upon at said meeting.

SECTION 5. Any member in good standing who is otherwise entitled to voting privileges may vote by absentee ballot at any election which is scheduled more than 30 days in advance, provided the member's request for an absentee ballot is made in writing (or email) upon the secretary, postmarked or delivered (or emailed) no less than 5 days prior to the election. The absentee ballot shall be filled out by the voting member, placed in a sealed envelope bearing the member's signature across the sealed flap, and delivered to the secretary before the tabulation of votes begins. Any absentee ballot not meeting the above requirements and which is not in the secretary's possession in a timely fashion shall be void and disregarded.

ARTICLE V of By-Laws

Officers

SECTION 1. The officers of the Corporation shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Competition Director, Editor, Governor, Social Director, Director of Summer Festival, Director of Public Relations, Membership Director, and two Members at Large, all of

whom shall constitute the Executive Committee of the Corporation and shall be elected by the membership at the November General Membership Meeting of each calendar year. Any two of the said offices, except President and Vice President, may be held by one person.

SECTION 2. Nominations for all officers will be accepted during the months of September and October with the election at the November General Membership Meeting. Election of officers shall be by ballot, and officers must be members of the Corporation. The officers shall begin their duties on or before the first meeting of the fiscal year, unless otherwise determined by the Directors, and such officers shall hold their office for one year or until re-elected. The name of the successful Governor candidate will be submitted to the National Council of Corvette Clubs in November.
