General Meeting, September 19, 2013

C4 and 1982 C3 crossfire injection system replaced with quadrajet carburetors. The C7 will be in the M racing class, or the K class for drags. Other rule book changes that will be voted on include novice class riders, flyers won't require maps, a high speed license will require 40 runs of low speeds or a driving school, E class will be by itself, the F, G & H class will be together, J & K will be combined. All cars with race tires will be in group 2. The West Region nominations for a one year term: RE, Jon Manz; RCD, Joe Eller; RMD, Sheila Wyman; Secretary, Larry Bebee. Let Gary know if you would like a write in vote or have any comments on the proposed changes he will be voting on. The Cedar Rapids club will host the WR awards banquet in March. There has been no release of the C7 logo. The 2013 corvette raffle went to a couple from Michigan. October 19 & 20 at Mall of the Bluffs for low speeds with a shorter course on Saturday since a portion of the lot is in use by DOT. On Sunday the course will be similar to Summer Festival. Ron Bockerman was asked to speak about the Kearney drags, hotel arrangements and the great opportunity we have this year. He gave a little history about the "old-time" drag racers and the goal of setting a national record with Jerry Benedict behind the wheel. Ron reminded us this is the Dave Hawks Memorial Drag Races, so even if you don't race come out and support the event. Ron said the MAM 1/8 mile drags are under discussion for club records.

Summer Festival Director, Anita Poss gave a recap of the awesome SF and thanked all the people who came out to support the event plus all the chairmen and workers that made it happen. The results are done and the birthday bash was a success with a visit from Bill and Hillary and the Village People, featuring Don Angeroth as the policeman, Ron Bockerman as the cowboy, Bob Speckmann the construction worker, PL the biker, Jake Cartwright the Army man, Steve Walling the Indian with Kris Speckmann as the naughty nurse. Over \$1000 of prizes was awarded and everyone received a commemorative coozie and a profit was made! Anita gave special thanks to EJ, Palmer & Allen who were her back up people and Denny & Mary Ann who provided the place. They will have the grand opening of the Stumble Inn on 9/28 and encourages everyone to attend. Recognition was given to Tim Ogle who has been a member only since June, for coming within 3 points of the overall winner. The overall winner for men was Randy Williams. Did You Know?

One of the Job Description duties of Secretary: The secretary shall prepare and distribute ballots for the annual election of officers, **including the distribution of absentee ballots** in accord with the ARTICLE III, SECTION 5 of the BY-LAWS.

I want to be sure everyone is aware of our election procedures and your right to vote by absentee ballot should you be unable to attend the November 21st General Meeting. Feel free to provide your stamped, self-addressed envelope at the September or October meeting and I will mail a ballot once nominations are closed after the October meeting. Email requests are also accepted for this purpose.

ARTICLE III of By-Laws

Voting of the Members

SECTION 1. All general members in good standing in attendance at any regular monthly general meeting or special meeting as provided for by the Operating Rules of Procedure, shall constitute a quorum for the transacting of all business at that meeting. A member is in good standing when all dues are paid in full.

SECTION 2. Each eligible member in attendance shall be entitled to one vote.

SECTION 3. A majority of the quorum present at any special meeting or regular meeting may require a secret ballot to be taken on any issue or election which is to be voted on by the membership.


SECTION 4. At both regular meetings and special meetings, unless otherwise specified herein, a majority vote of the quorum present shall be necessary to determine issues voted upon at said meeting.


SECTION 5. Any member in good standing who is otherwise entitled to voting privileges may vote by absentee ballot at any election which is scheduled more than 30 days in advance, provided the member's request for an absentee ballot is made in writing (or email) upon the secretary, postmarked or delivered (or emailed) no less than 5 days prior to the election. The absentee ballot shall be filled out by the voting member, placed in a sealed envelope bearing the member's signature across the sealed flap, and delivered to the secretary before the tabulation of votes begins. Any absentee ballot not meeting the above requirements and which is not in the secretary's possession in a timely fashion shall be void and disregarded.

ARTICLE V of By-Laws

Officers

SECTION 1. The officers of the Corporation shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Competition Director, Editor, Governor, Social Director, Director of Summer Festival, Director of Public Relations, Membership Director, and two Members at Large, all of
