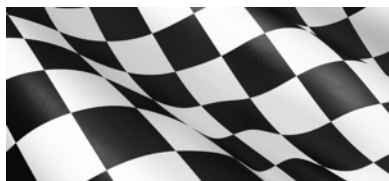

FLASHBACK!

How it all began

It's 1960. Two Air Force sergeants stationed at Offutt AFB – Gerald N. (Jerry) Sievers and Earl H. Lee – meet at the NCO Club. Both own Corvettes, and they would like to meet other Corvette enthusiasts. On January 20, 1960 Jerry writes a letter to Chevrolet Motor Division in Detroit, requesting information about organizing a "Corvette Owners Club." Chevrolet responds by sending Jerry a Corvette Owner's Kit and assigning Omaha GM Zone Sales Promotion Manager Dick Novotny to assist in establishing a club.

The first organizational meeting is held on February 21, 1960 at the General Motors Training Center on 80th and Dodge Street. Dick Novotny and Acting President Earl Lee have invited all known Corvette owners in the Omaha area to the meeting. Novotny opens the meeting and offers the use of the facility to Corvette owners. Lee tells the attendees that the club "will be more interested in social driving (rallies, gymkhanas, etc.) than drag races." *[This is certainly ironic because Cornhusker Corvette Club is known today throughout NCCC for the large number of drag records it holds.]* Club dues are set at \$5 per year. Events are priced at \$1 for a member and \$2 for a guest.

The second organizational meeting is held on March 13, 1960 at the GM Training Center. There are 15 paid memberships. A husband and wife share a membership, which carries one vote. Members vote unanimously that any Corvette enthusiast will qualify as a member, but only Corvettes will be allowed to participate in driving events or competition. A membership year will be from 1 January to 31 December, and dues will be delinquent after 1 March.

Several names for the Club are proposed, and the members choose CORNHUSKER CORVETTE CLUB.

The third organizational meeting is held on March 27, 1960 at the GM Training Center. A document entitled CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS OF THE CORNHUSKER CORVETTE CLUB OF OMAHA, NEBRASKA is read and approved unanimously. It has been prepared by Jerome and Jeannie Given, assisted by Jack Huntley, Sy Weisinger, and Bill Huggins. Jerome Given is a motorcycle racing champion, a Shriner, a licensed pilot, and General Council for the Union Pacific Railroad.

card has been designed and CCC has been registered in the Club Directory of *Corvette News* magazine. The Club is an exhibitor at the Nebraska Motor Sports Auto Show in the Omaha Civic Auditorium, displaying a 1960 Corvette provided by GM. (See photo.) Nine new members are recruited in the 2-day show. On June 5th, 1960, CCC's first driving event, the Cornhusker Spring Rally, is held.

By June CCC has 56 names on the mailing list, including 37 members. The Club is off to a strong start, but the tenure of the founders is short. In November 1960, Jerry and Joyce Sievers are chosen for a special 3-year assignment at a NATO post near Paris. Earl Lee is reassigned to a post in Tripoli.

Where are the founders now? Jerry and Joyce Sievers live in Bellevue. Jerome Given, age 91, lives on a horse farm near Elkhorn. No-one knows what became of Earl Lee.

HISTORICAL FOOTNOTES



When Palmer and I joined CCC in 1990, each new member received a small, professionally printed but undated brochure entitled "Cornhusker Corvette Club Ltd." In the brochure, the anonymous author stated, "The Cornhusker Corvette Club (CCC) was originally organized in 1961 by the Omaha Shriner organization for the main purpose of being a 'parade' type group." However, in a letter dated September 22, 1994, Jerry Sievers disputed this claim, although he acknowledged that several Shriners had joined CCC. The writer probably confused CCC with the Tangier Shrine's famous Corvette Patrol.

In 2001, while I was doing research for CCC's 40th (actually 41st) anniversary celebration, I interviewed several "old timers" who mentioned a Corvette club that held meetings at the Storz Brewery prior to 1960. I found no evidence that this group founded CCC, although some members probably joined CCC.

Transmissions – Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow

For those of us old enough to remember the 'good old days' of the 60's and 70's, the Big Three were manufacturing so called 'Supercars' (ground pounding vehicles with a high-compression V-8, a 4-barrel carb, and a rock-crusher manual transmission) in pursuit of 12 second quarter mile ETs. Great fun vehicles, but they were not best suited for the family ride. However, most of our classic muscle cars from back then were, in reality, assembled from components that were only slightly more 'high performance' than the basic-transportation grocery-getters that they were derived from. The standard package on most of the go-fast vehicles included a little higher compression than normal, a

medium-sized 4-barrel carburetor, a limited-slip differential, and a choice of a manual 3- or 4-speed transmission or an automatic transmission. To the die-hard enthusiast, an automatic transmission in a performance car was sacrilegious. But what the auto makers realized was that for every hot rod gearhead that wanted a true strip vehicle there were many more who wanted an everyday driver that would be dual purpose, a grocery getter with some attention-getting punch.

What a wondrous time to have a family sedan with ease and comfort of operation and also have enough attention-getting attitude to be fun to drive when the owner had the

urge to use it. This dual-personality nature is what marks the difference between a typical 'backyard hot-rod' and a true factory-built 'Supercar' from the 60's and 70's. The flexible abilities of these cars were due in part to their being equipped with an automatic transmission. Yes, *an automatic transmission!*

Many seem to find an automatic transmission to be a mystery of sorts, a complication and almost a contradiction to our thoughts for reliability and performance. Even to many very knowledgeable technicians they seem to be nothing more than big, ugly, hard to comprehend combinations of planetary gear sets, valve bodies, modulators, valves, pistons,

clutches, solenoids, and torque converters. Fortunately for all of us, the automatic transmission is a very durable contraption (when taken care of) that will give us many years and miles of trouble-free service.

Today's vehicles have morphed into what some call a "complicated monster". I say "a beautiful work in progress of technology." Since I manage a retail auto repair facility, I hear people say "They sure don't make them like they use to". My answer is usually "No they sure don't, *thank God!*" A flooded engine in the winter, a choke to deal with, no heated seats, no CD or MP3 player, an engine overhaul at 80,000 miles. Today it's nothing to see vehicles with 200,000 or 300,000 miles on them in the shop for minor repairs. I am glad they don't make them like they used to. I love technology.

Today's vehicles, however, have a much more complicated transmission than a simple modulator or cable-controlled transmission. Today's

vehicles are computer-controlled with what is called "fuzzy logic". They still use hydraulics to actuate the clutches and bands, but each hydraulic circuit is controlled by an electric solenoid. This simplifies the plumbing on the transmission and allows for more

advanced control schemes.

The automatic transmission has evolved into an integral part of the performance and safety aspect of driving. Yes, *I said safety*. Automatic transmissions have been changing from purely hydro-mechanical controls to electronic controls since the late 1980s. Since then, development has been iterative, and today designs have evolved in several stages of electronic automatic transmission control development. Transmission solenoids are a key component to these control units.

The evolution of the automatic transmission and electronic controls has allowed the progression in recent years. The modern automatic transmission is now able to achieve better fuel economy, reduced engine emissions, greater shift system reliability, improved shift feel, improved shift speed, and improved vehicle handling. The huge range of programmability offered by a computer allows an automatic

transmission to be used with appropriate characteristics for each application or situation.

Electronically controlled transmissions have even more elaborate control strategies. The Computers monitor vehicle speed, manifold pressure, coolant temp, throttle position, and a host of other parameter IDs. The transmission controller (if equipped) can monitor the engine speed, whether the brake pedal is being pressed, and even the anti-lock braking system. Using this information and an advanced control strategy based on fuzzy logic (a method of programming control systems using human-type reasoning) electronically controlled transmissions can do things such as:

- Downshifting automatically when going downhill to control speed and reduce wear on the brakes,
- Upshifting when braking on a slippery surface to reduce the braking torque applied by the engine.
- Inhibiting the upshift when going into a turn on a winding road.

Today's transmission is a very important part of not only the performance of your vehicle, but the safety of that vehicle as well.

Who knows what tomorrow will bring, but I can't wait to find out.

⇒ Always remember: maintain your transmission, keep the fluid changed, and it will treat you well.

CCC won in 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012 & 2013.

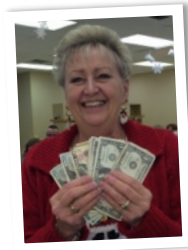

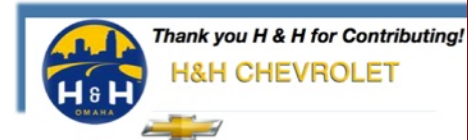

Thank you for your comments and for having me represent you as a member at large for 2014. Don't hesitate to let me know of concerns and also positive comments on the CCC.

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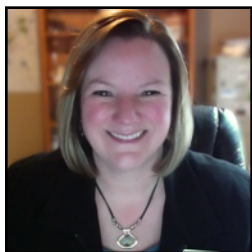
