The first stop on our tour was the beautiful Lauritzen Gardens - Omaha's Botanical Center and an arboretum located at 100 Bancroft Street.



Lauritzen Gardens is a living museum of unique four-season plant displays, maintained to the highest standards. It is also the home to many concerts and weddings throughout the summer. The visitor and education center is home to hundreds of garden-hosted festivals and special events, adult horticulture and children's education classes, three seasonal floral shows, corporate events and meetings, weddings and other family celebrations each year.



Our host, Cheryl Sondyj filled everyone in on the details of the gardens, and explained what the visitors will see when they are here next summer.






Mary Our Queen Festival becomes Corvette Row






