So call your friends – make sure they are going to be there – it is going to be a great evening.


Huber Chevrolet is continuing to support this event and makes your attendance very affordable.

General Meeting Minutes

June 20, 2019

Kevin Reit, Club President, presided over the meeting.

- 8. Our Club has won the National Championship for 13 years. A group of racers in Indiana have formed a club to beat us this year. We can roll over and let them have the championship or we can get as many cars out to as many events as possible. We also have a couple concourse events that will generate NCCC points.
- 9, Gary Brisbois, West Region RCD and Kathy Brisbois, National Parliamentarian, were introduced.
- 10. Jerry and Kathy Koraleski are still collecting non-perishable food items for the Stephens Center and Kathy Brisbois is collecting toiletries for a women's shelter.
- 11. J B Benedict is still collecting newspapers for Hearts United for Animals.

<u>Jayne Reit</u> read the names of members with birthdays in June.

The Speaker was one of our Club Members. John Salmans spoke about his company and Club Sponsor, Service One.

48 State Drive for Autism

Mike and Adam Straub May 29th - June 16th, 2019

1 Corvette. 19 days. 48 states and 10,000 miles. A 46-year-old dad with his 15-year-old autistic son, on a mission to get a picture in front of each of the lower-48 state signs. A mission to raise \$48,000 for Autism Action Partnership, a local non-profit that their family believes in. And a mission to create memories of a lifetime, for both father and son.



Exhausted! It was the end of day 15, a 14-hour driving day - and I was tired. That hotel bed was calling my name. But I still had to finish my nightly 2-hour ritual of copying pictures and videos from the camera memory cards to the portable hard drive, picking the best pictures from the day, copying files to an internet folder for the press to use, and then posting and responding to comments on Facebook and Twitter. My computer was not cooperating, and it would be 11:30 before I would turn out the lights.

That was the fast pace we kept for most of 19 days. Get up around 6, take a quick shower, eat hotel breakfast food, wipe the morning dew (and some of yesterday's grime) off the Corvette, and be on the road by 7:30. Then we would drive. And drive. Most days were 10-13 hours in the car. Our longest day was 17 hours. With every stop there was a sense of urgency to get back on the road and keep the wheels turning. Scenic overlooks were mostly overlooked. And when we did stop, it was usually for less than 5 minutes. There simply wasn't time. 10,000 miles in 18 driving days leaves very little time for anything but driving. And of course, taking pictures of state signs.

It was my son, Adam's idea. It was his turn to pick a destination for my annual 1:1 father-son road trip. My two boys alternate years, tossing me ideas for destinations and then I weave a driving route of mostly back-roads and scenic byways. The kind of roads on which you want to drive a Laguna-Blue 2016 Corvette Z51, with the top stowed in the back. When he suggested we drive to all 48 states, I gave him about 3 weeks to change his mind. He didn't budge. Driving to 48 states is one thing but picking a route that ensures the ability to stop safely and take pictures of each state sign took nearly a month of planning.

#48forAutism was the opportunity of a lifetime. Once Adam convinced me to do the trip, I knew it was something special. I felt it could be used as a fundraising platform, helping spread the word about Autism Action Partnership (AAP). AAP, a local non-profit, had already helped Adam by funding the Circle of Friends program at Millard Public Schools (and hundreds of other schools). AAP also provides workforce development assistance to those on the spectrum searching for meaningful employment. Our family received so much community support for our efforts. It was a powerful, yet humbling experience.

The first day of the trip was amazing. Millard West High School hosted a send-off, with hundreds of students lining the sidewalks as Adam escaped school for the last time as a freshman. About 25 fellow Cornhusker Corvette Club members joined, forming a lineup of eye-candy and thunder for all to admire. For the first 15 miles, we were escorted by 16 motorcycles from the Omaha Police Department, whose annual police escort training just happened to coincide with our trip.

We were riding high that first day until it happened. With just 40 miles to go, the front bumper of the Corvette smacked a pheasant at 70 mph outside of Aberdeen, South Dakota. The second day started at a body shop, magically popping out the massive dent.

Our best moments on the trip were when people reached out to us while driving. As people donated or commented on social media, a notification would ring out on our phone and we would both get a boost of energy. We did manage to spend several hours at beaches in both Florida and Maine. A few hours out of the car was a true luxury on the trip. Besides the interviews in Nebraska, we were also asked for TV interviews in California, Mississippi and Pennsylvania. Wayne Carini invited us to stop at his F40 Motorsports shop in Connecticut. (Wayne is the father of an autistic daughter and is the TV host of Chasing Classic Cars.) Jeff Conger, a world-traveled photographer, offered to do a free photo-shoot in Montana. Changing the route to



allow for those side detours was a challenge and usually resulted in an even-later arrival time at the hotel. But it was well worth it -- memories of a lifetime.

Adam made it through the trip without complaining much at all. His escape was to watch Friends (the 90's sitcom) or listen to music on YouTube. He wasn't really interested in the scenery, or how the houses, barns and towns all had their own unique style in different parts of the country. "Maybe when I'm older, I'll appreciate that stuff." That was an honest answer - in typical Adam style.

I finally asked him "Why are we doing this trip, Adam?" He quickly answered: "All I wanted was pictures of the state signs. And to get donations for AAP." Mission accomplished.

It's not too late! You can still help us raise \$48,000 for Autism Action Partnership (a non-profit). No donations are used to pay trip expenses.

Exploring Robber's Cave

There are not very many caves in Nebraska that are open to the public for exploration. So Margee Palmer and I were surprised when we heard that Dale and Alice Williamsen were planning to lead a Corvette caravan to Robber's Cave in Lincoln. We learned that the cave was formed naturally over thousands of years and was used



by the Pawnee Indians for spiritual purposes. Robber's Cave is named for the outlaw Jesse James,



although historians doubt that the James gang ever actually hid out there.

We drove from Millard to Lincoln on June 22nd. Our tour was scheduled for 1:00 PM, allowing time beforehand for a group photo and lunch. Perry Dawes' nephew, Nick Dawes, arranged a leisurely sit-down meal in the dining room in the Wilderness Ridge

Lodge. The Lodge is a magnificent timber and stone structure that was

built in Hamilton, Montana, disassembled, and reassembled in Lincoln in 2003.

The entrance to Robber's Cave is beneath the Blue Blood Brewing Company, which opened in 2016 (but unfortunately closed earlier this year). Our tour guide was Joel Green, educator, historian, and author of *Robber's Cave: Truths*,



Legends, Recollections. He explained that the cave was enlarged in 1869 for beer storage by the Lincoln Brewery. Over the years it was also used as a dance hall, a constant temperature winter refuge, a meeting hall, and even a brothel. It was closed during the 1970s but opened again in 1985. George

The Men Who Went to the Moon Favored Corvettes

Astronauts have a long history with America's Sports Car.

ifty years ago this coming July 20, two Americans—Neil

Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin—landed their lunar module Eagle on the moon. They were two of the 29 NASA astronauts who flew on Project Apollo, the grand finale in the challenge set forth in 1961

by President John F. Kennedy "to achieving the goal, before this decade is out, of landing a man on the moon and returning him safely to the Earth." Back home, the men who completed the Apollo missions with such swagger and success were partial to one four-wheeled road rocket above all others: the Chevrolet Corvette.

To honor that comradeship of speed, the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky, is showcasing three Corvettes once owned by NASA astronauts, part of an exhibition entitled "From Gas Station to Space Station" that runs through July 30. A friend of mine owns two of the "Astrovettes" on display, one of which I've actually driven.

Alan Shepard's '68 Stingray convertible is there. The first American in space and, later, commander of Apollo 14 (he performed the famous golf shot on the moon), Shepard was a longtime Vette fanatic. Soon after his pioneering Mercury spaceflight on May 5, 1961, GM president Ed Cole gifted him with a gleaming new '62 Corvette. Naturally, most of the other six "Original Seven" Mercury astronauts—and many of the new arrivals NASA was adding for the Gemini and Apollo programs—wanted Corvettes, too. In stepped former Indy 500 winner Jim Rathmann, owner of a Chevy dealership near Cape Canaveral, Florida, who saw the space-hero branding potential and helped create a special lease program in which astronauts could drive a new Corvette every year for the skyhigh sum of \$1.

Far cooler than Shepard's '68 is the 1969 Corvette formerly owned by Alan Bean. Along with commander Pete Conrad, Bean walked on the moon as part of Apollo 12. All three members of the crew—including command module pilot Dick Gordon—drove matching Vettes painted in a black-on-gold "wings" scheme created by famed industrial designer Alex Tremulis. When I interviewed Bean in 2013, he waxed rhapsodic about those heady days: "What could be better than being 37, training all day to go to the moon, and then when you get off work you jump in your Corvette and drive it around Cocoa Beach?"



Enter my Texas-based pal Danny Reed. In 1971, Reed—a lifelong NASA enthusiast—spotted Bean's car on a GMAC lot in Austin. He won the thing in a sealed auction for "all I could afford," \$3,230. In the late 1990s, Reed had his prize restored to better-than-new condition by famed Corvette specialist Ray Repczynski. In 2013, Reed graciously let me drive the car for a *MotorTrend Classic* feature. To me, a NASA-obsessed kid of the 1960s who followed the missions live on TV, piloting Bean's beloved Astrovette felt like walking on the moon myself.



A year later, sharing the new-for-2014 C7 Corvette, I spent a week driving from Florida's Kennedy Space Center to the Johnson Space Center in Houston, Texas, with legendary Apollo 7 astronaut Walt Cunningham. Thanks to Reed, who met us at JSC, Cunningham got to see his old friend Alan Bean's Astrovette up close once again. (Search "Epic Drives Ep. 25" on YouTube for a video of our trip.) Recently, Cunningham and I caught up, and he reaffirmed his Corvette fever: "The Corvette has had an amazing evolution. My first one was a 1964. The most recent Corvettes have evolved from nice-looking to wonderful performance." Cunningham, who at 87 drives a 2015 Vette, joked that he'd like to buy a new ZR1 but "the price is out of my league!"

Two years ago I got an email from Reed that started, "Art—you won't believe it." He had "stumbled across" the '71 Corvette of Apollo 15 command-module pilot Al Worden, again in Austin. He bought it on the spot. "It's almost a rust bucket," Reed told me. Yet here was another treasure. Much like Bean's, Worden's car was one of a custom-painted trio for the crew of Apollo 15; Worden's Corvette was white, commander Dave Scott had a blue one, and lunar module pilot Jim Irwin's was red. All three had red, white, and blue stripes down the hood. Thus far, Reed has done minimal restoration on the car—but it's now on display in Bowling Green for all to see.

Before his death in 2018, Bean told me about the time he let his son's friends drive his Astrovette: "Funny, really. They might not remember anything else about me, not even talk about my flying to the moon. But they remembered that I let them drive that Corvette."
