- Old Union—classroom addition/reconfiguration
- Technology projects—increasing infrastructure, cabling
- Rockenbaugh—replaced HVAC
- Old Union—HVAC upgrade soon
- Data Center—HVA replaced
- Indoor training facility at CSHS—large overhead fans installed
- CMS—new installations to help hallway noise

# Randy Stuart (Executive Director of Technology)

- Digital Dragons—need for consistent student device platforms in the classrooms
- Grades 7-12 students will be given touchscreen Dell laptops with protective sleeve. The laptops will be restricted (like on-campus computers) with at-home filtering as well
- Website being developed for deployment of the devices, expectations, device fees, and procedure for repairs
- Dates of Distribution: Aug 13-16 for CHS/CSHS (one grade per day—TBA), 1-3PM, or 5-7PM
- \$45 annual fee (no fee for free/reduced lunch students)
- Accidental Repair
  - o 1st offense, no charge
  - o 2<sup>nd</sup> offense, cost of repair minus annual fee
  - o 3rd offense, full cost of repair
- Each campus to have tech support available for teacher and students, including loaner laptops
- Professional Development to be planned for staff
- AV refresh: Interactive Epson projectors for grades 5-12, New Line Interactive display for K-4th
- Broadcast carts (for announcements) at JES, and CES
- Infrastructure: campuses to have wireless access ports in the classrooms. Installation of servers and additional storage over spring break
- Security cameras to be increased at campues
