- CHS items (7) greater than \$500 reviewed. Suggestion made to increase number of requested Drone kits from 2 (\$628.00) to 3. Motion to approve items, with the exception of charging stations by Angela Schwartz, seconded by Annett Mader.
- Discussion over requested CHS charging stations—cost seems high for how many students can benefit. Is there a plan for additional charging options that will be provided for by current planned improvements (Bond)? Committee to find out additional information/ discuss with Mr. Giamanco.
- Baccalaureate is scheduled for May 27th at Whites Chapel. Currently there are 45 students helping to plan the interfaith service to include music, speakers, and 12 faith statements. The service will last approximately one hour. Invitations are currently at the printers and will be sent out to senior families next week.

Distracted Driving

Sgt. Steven Sewell and Valerie Snyder, Community Liaison, of the Southlake Police Department https://www.cityofsouthlake.com/1974/Distracted-Driving-Education

- Video shown of actual incident of wrong way driver on Hwy 114 in Southlake, including 911 dispatch calls. The
 resulting crash caused injuries and a fatality.
- This video was shown to CHS 9th and 10th graders last year.
- In Texas, drivers under the age of 18 are not allowed to use their phone at any time.
- Can put settings on phone to not allow texts to come through while driving
- Parents need to remember to not text their children while they are driving
- Students can sign a pledge card to promise not to use their phones when driving
- Distracted driving is difficult to enforce in Texas—police need parents to help kids understand the potentially life long impact of distracted driving
- Curfew in Southlake for students under 17 years: after midnight on Fridays and Saturday, after 11PM from Monday through Thursday. (with exceptions for work and school events)
- Southlake has approximately 12-16 arrests for DUI's per month
- Southlake has a No Refusal Policy at all times, can obtain warrants quickly to have blood drawn.
- Blood draws show more than alcohol usage (drugs, etc.), breathalyzers used less frequently than in the past
- Game Over program for CHS/CSHS to happen in May, SLPD to help

SLPD to host a women's self defense class in April
