CISD's new Voluntary Random Drug Testing Program, <https://www.southlakecarroll.edu/Page/2866>

- Beginning after Spring Break 2019, Carroll ISD implemented a **Voluntary Random Drug Testing Program** for students in grades 7-12. The program was designed to provide support and resources to parents/guardians of participating students; therefore, a positive drug test for a participating student does not result in discipline consequences.
- The program is strictly voluntary and free of cost to students and families, while serving as a deterrent to illegal drug use and assisting the district in enforcing a drug-free educational environment. The policy approved by the CISD School Board in the fall of 2018 is modeled after a program in Keller ISD, and will serve as a two-year pilot program in Carroll.
