1. What are school hours?

Kinder to 4th: 7:40 am - 2:55 pm Pre-K: 7:40 am - 2:00 pm

2. Where can I find the calendar for the school year?

The school calendar is available on the <u>Rockenbaugh Elementary webpage</u>. Please check the calendar for specific grade level and school wide activities. Additionally, the RESPTO includes a calendar on <u>RESPTO.com</u>.

3. Where do I get a bus pass?

Bus passes are purchased directly from Carroll ISD. Visit <u>www.southlakecarroll.edu</u>. and select Departments, Transportation Services.

4. How do I pay for school lunches?

The Child Nutrition Department is introducing its new computerized Point of Sale (POS) system this year. The system will launch the first day of school, August 19, 2019. Students will use their current ID number ("S" number) to access their lunch accounts. This number can be found in Family Access under Student Information. Parents will need to create a MySchoolBucks account to deposit money and view purchases. Visit MySchoolBucks.com with your child's name and "S" number to create an account, make deposits, set up auto payments, and low balance notifications. Check prepayments are also accepted; simply place your child(s) ID number(s) on the check. Visit <u>www.southlakecarroll.edu</u> and select Departments, Child Nutrition.

5. What is Skyward/Family Access?

Skyward and Family Access are a district-wide website used for school registration, family contact info and electronic repository for report cards, attendance, etc. Visit <u>www.southlakecarroll.edu</u> and select Parents, Family Access.

6. *What is Rocken Registration?

Rocken Registration, or Homeroom Registration, is the opportunity for parents to join the PTO and for your child to register for class parties and activities. It also ensures that students are included in the school directory. Classroom dues are paid via Rocken Registration which begins in August. You will be able to complete your Rocken Registration when you complete your CISD Annual Student Verification (August 8 - August 19) or by visiting <u>RESPTO.com</u> and clicking on the Homeroom Registration button.

7. What are classroom parties?

Classroom parties are organized by the PTO and paid with classroom dues. Classroom dues are collected via Rocken Registration. Classroom parties vary by grade and include Holiday, Valentine's, and End of Year parties.

8. What are Rockenbaugh Clubs?

After school clubs begin in October and are first come first served. Some clubs are grade level specific. Clubs include Art, Coding, Lab Assistants, etc.

9. What is Dragon Dad's Club?

Meetings and activities for Dad's and kids. Often held on a Friday before school with local speakers and breakfast provided.

10. What is "Dad of the Day"?

Dad of the Day is an opportunity for RES Dads to join their kids in the morning at school. The Dad of the Day role includes greeting families in car line, an appearance on Dragon Tale News, and visiting your child's classroom.

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Sign-ups begin in September on a first come, first served basis. Generally organized by the Dragon Dads club. All volunteers are required to complete a background check.
