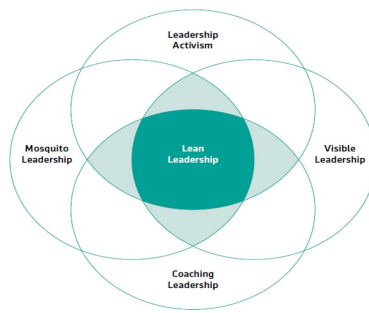
As this Newsletter is a 'double month' edition, it is packed full of insight.

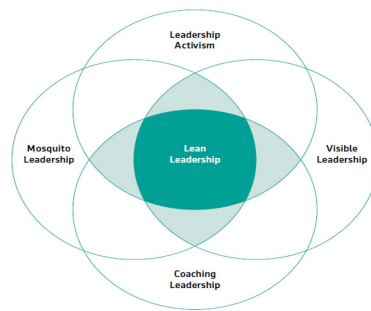


Many Lean Programs are underwater but what are the signs and what can you do about it? In Part 1 of this article, I cover the first 4 indicators.

Lean: A lifetime of Journeys

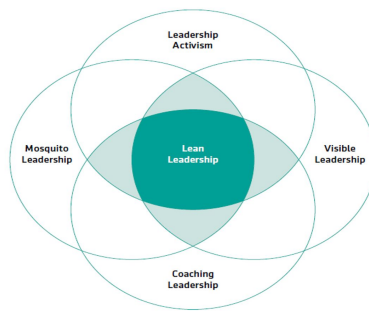


Lean is a journey but we need to know where we're going and what to do when we arrive. In this article I describe how Lean is actually a lifetime of journeys for the Lean Leader.
