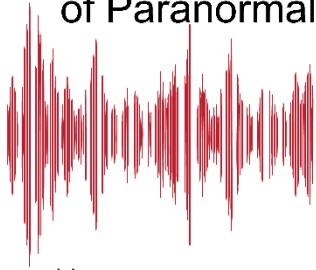

Accomac Inn – History and Spirit(s) Map October 2018

Reverend James Anderson: Born on November 17, 1678, in Glasgow, Lanarkshire, Scotland.. Purchased the land and received a permit for the Ferry. The Accomac Inn was 1st Keeseey's Ferry – then became Anderson's Ferry in 1742; a hotel was added in 1771

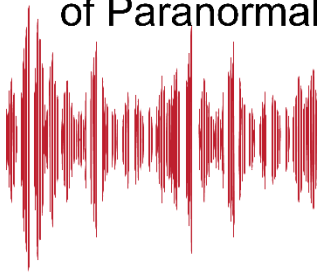

Disclaimer: The following are impressions from the Team “sensitives”

Attic

- Suicide Victim.
- Mary Coyle will often come up to “talk”.

Floor below Attic

- Room right of Attic – angry woman; stays in the corner; arrived when small antique table was moved out; 5’2” +/-.

Large Dining Room above the Stairs

- Man in corner; black boots; very quiet – face to corner; warns of back room.

Bathroom Hall

- Random Spirits – prostitutes?

Downstairs Bar

- Angry man that does not like women; red “velvety” smoking jacket.
- Sometimes a prostitute (likes to play tricks) will come in and pretend she is him.
- The “Captain” will sometimes come in as well – seems to communicate with “Angry Man”.

Cellar

- Near the door: “Captain”; 5’ +/-; grey beard; dressed like a fisherman – probably the apparition. There was a fisherman’s bar there, very rough. There was a bartender called “Shorty”.
- Back Cellar. Sometimes a little girl, pink ribbon in her hair, will come to play hide and seek. Looking for her parents – died in fire?
- Mary Coyle did come there this year to let us know that something that was done with plants outside made her angry and there was going to be a “punishment”. The Inn built a garden this year over where her garden was. She loved to garden. Within 2 weeks, the flooding happened and the Accomac had to close.
- Another female spirit – probably NOT Mary Coyle – also came to tell us an Event the Accomac was planning made her angry; Accomac Staff confirmed an Event was being planned they felt might be the one (Bryt).

Grave

- Mary Coyle will sometimes visit the Grave. If we stay off the rock, she will stand/sit near; she is ok with us being there.

Warehouse

- Johnny Coyle will sometimes talk about regrets. He will usually only talk when there are no women there.
- Emily Myers is very specific about who she will talk to. Very shy and sad.
- Sometimes the prostitute will show up to pretend to be Emily or Johnny.
