## WORLD HELICE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Congratulations to the U.S. Helice Team, who turned in a dominating performance at the World Championships in July at the Clube de Caçadores do Porto in Porto, Portugal

Both the Men's and Women's team won Gold Medals, and T.J. Bayer won Silver Medals in both Men's and Junior competition.

Here is a summary of notable results...

### **USA Men's Team**

Gold Medal with score of 56/60

### **USA Women's Team**

Gold Medal with score of 23/30

### **USA Veteran's Team**

Bronze Medal with score of 23/30

### **Men's Silver Medal**

T.J. Bayer with score of 38/40

### **Women's Silver Medal**

Amy Dement with score of 35/40 + shootoff

### **Junior Silver Medal**

T.J. Bayer with score of 38/40

### **Veteran's 4th Place**

Theodore Wells with score of 34/40

In addition, Jerry Steadham won the Preliminary Gran Prix event. Mimi Wilfong, based on her earlier performance at the European Championships (Gold) and aggregate score in the World Championships, was awarded the Women's World Cup Trophy.
