




# New Sign Up and Running

### **UCC ANNUAL CONFERENCE**

The Pacific Northwest Conference of the United Church of Christ invites you to our Annual Meeting, April 27 – 29 in Yakima, WA Celebrate the transforming power we experience in community!

It's More than just a "get to know you" exercise; intentional conversations that identify the needs of people in our communities can have a profound impact on our ministries and are a big part of the conference. Our theme this year, "Breaking Forth", celebrates our ministry of building deeper relationships and growing vitality in our churches and communities.

This year we'll continue to deepen relationships and strengthen vitality in every setting of our conference. Leading the Conference as keynote speaker will be **Bishop Dwayne Royster**, from Living Water UCC in Philadelphia. Bishop Royster is the Political Director for PICO (People Improving Communities through Organizing). Using a large group workshop method, we'll learn and then practice how to identify and address the root causes of problems in our communities. Based on a belief in the transformation of people, institutions and communities, this will help us, as people of faith, learn how to partner with others so that we can make a difference.

Each church is entitled to three delegates. Our Council has approved **Cameron McL**. as one of our delegates and he has agreed to represent United Christian Church of Renton. The Registration Fee will be paid by the church out of the Conference Expense.

#### Renton Ecumenical Association of Churches (REACH)

The new Executive Director, **Rev. Bianca Davis-Lovelace**, sent out a report of their accomplishments in 2017 and needs at the end of the first quarter of 2018. She wrote:

"As we come to the end of the first quarter of 2018 REACH is facing a **SEVERE** decrease in monetary resources. As much as we truly appreciate our volunteers, donated time, food, and supplies DO NOT PAY STAFF & KEEP OUR PROGRAMS RUNNING. We need to save money to move our meal program into a leased space before the end of the year when our free space is no longer available to us. After March we cannot make payroll and we cannot operate without our paid staff.

We continue to look at where we can further cut expenses without cutting services to our clients. We need help to keep our important work going. Please help us continue to serve "the least of these."
