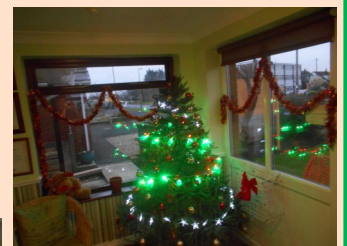
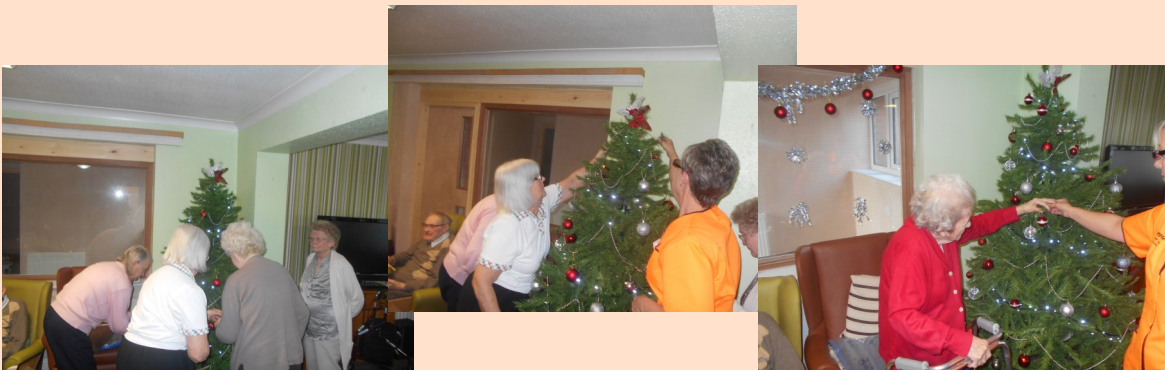

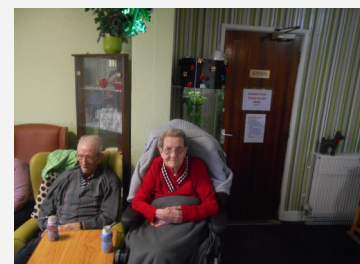
Christmas Day Photos

Dear Manager

As I am sure you are aware General Practice is under intense and ever increasing pressure for a variety of reasons including an ever ageing population with more complex medical problems and severe problems with recruitment.

In light of this the partners at The Over Wyre Medical Centre have had numerous discussions and have realised that we will no longer be able to provide a weekly/bi-weekly 'Ward Round' at your Care Home. These visits take up a huge amount of time both in terms of the actual review of the patients and the administration that ensues. This is a service that is above and beyond the requirements of the General Medical Services Contract and GPs are under no contractual obligation to provide home visits. In addition to this patients are usually best managed at the medical centre where there is full access to patient records and investigations such as ECGs and blood tests.

The introduction of the WIN Team means that all your patients and those with chronic problems are regularly reviewed for medical and/or social problems. In essence this means that there is often a duplication of work. In addition to this most of the residents are in fact mobile and are transportable to hospital outpatient appointments and are therefore able to be brought into the surgery for reviews. We already operate a policy of only offering home visits to patients that are bedbound, terminal or so severely unwell that if they were to be brought into the surgery it would make their condition worse.

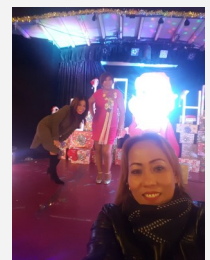
For this reason, we will only be able to offer visits to see patients that are considered too unwell or truly bedbound. For all other patients we ask that you make an appointment by calling reception.

Each nursing home will continue to have a named GP who has overall responsibility for care. We propose that there is a weekly or fortnightly telephone call with the care home to discuss any issues and arrange reviews as appropriate. Each GP will arrange this with you directly. If you would like to discuss any of the issues raised in this letter please do not hesitate to get in touch.




