STROKE AWARENESS

It was Stroke Awareness Day a couple of days ago on 29th October and, to follow on from last month's "Take Care of Your Heart Day", we thought we'd reiterate how to recognise the signs of stroke. There are over 100,000 strokes in the UK every year, which equates to 1 every 5 minutes so it's important to THINK: F-A-S-T!



FACE— the face may have dropped on one side, the person may not be able to smile, or their mouth or eye may have dropped.

ARMS—the person with suspected stroke may not be able to lift both arms and keep them there because of weakness or numbness in one arm.

SPEECH—their speech may be slurred or garbled, or the person may not be able to talk a all despite appearing to be awake.

TIME—it's time to dial 999 immediately if you see any of these signs or symptoms.
