TAYLOR County



Taylor County is located in the southern most tier of Iowa and is third in order eastward from the Missouri River. It is bounded on the north by Adams County, on the east by Ringgold County, on the south by the northern boundary of the State of Missouri, and on the west by Page County.

Taylor County covers about 537 square miles made up of rolling hills and small valleys along the t, Middle and West forks of the Hundred and Two, Honey Creek and the Platte rivers. It has opulation of 6,317, with a population density of 11.83/square mile, making it the ideal ation for it's primary occupation of agriculture.

lor County is made up of seventeen townships and eight incorporated cities, Including Iford (the County Seat), Lenox, New Market, Gravity, Sharpsburg, Clearfield, Blockton, and onway.

In 1833, what is now **Taylor County** was granted to the Pottawatomie Indians as a eservation, who relinquished all claims in June 1846. Taylor County became part of the state in 847. From the date of its establishment until its organization, **Taylor County** was attached to ottawattamie County for election, judicial and revenue purposes. It was formally organized in 851. The county was named in honor of Major General Zachary Taylor, Commander of the rmy of Occupation in the war with Mexico and later the twelfth president of the United States. arly settlers consisted mostly of persons from the southern states who thought they were in lave-holding northern Missouri.

FAMOUS FOR: Christmas Light Display in City Park, Annual Rodeo and the filming of The Crazies (2010)

New Market

FAMOUS FOR: Annual 4th of July Celebration & Fireworks

New Market was founded in 1881 when the railroad passed by the former towns of Memory and Dayton. The community of New Market was established as homes and businesses were relocated adjacent to the new rail line. Although New Market thrived and reached a peak population in 1920, it is still home to many residents who enjoy the quiet town and the sense of community it expresses. A few local businesses still serve these residents giving the town a daily buzz.

Each year community members (and neighbors!) celebrate their heritage with a tremendous 4th of July celebration which is always concluded with "southwest Iowa's finest fireworks display!" The two day event brings 1000s of people to the usually quite community where everyone enjoys the more simple things in life like:

Gravity

FAMOUS FOR: Clever Town Slogan: "If Gravity goes, we all go!" Founded in 1881, **Gravity** Iowa is the only town in the United States with it's name and was named after the Old Gravity Post Office which still serves the town today. At the peak of it's population in 1940, and one of the smallest towns in the county, it supported more churches then any other town in Taylor

Sharpsburg

Sharpsburg was founded in 1884 as a stop on the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad. A post office was established in 1886, and the city was incorporated in 1905. The small town is currently the home to roughly 90 residents where the post office is still in operation.

Conway

FAMOUS FOR: Birth Place of Mike Welday

Conway had its start in the year 1872 by the building of the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad through that territory. The town was incorporated in 1878 and is the birthplace of Lyndon Earl "Mike" Welday, a left-handed Major League Baseball outfielder who played for the Chicago White Sox in 1907 and 1909.

Clearfield

FAMOUS FOR: Iowa State Fair Shuttles

The **Clearfield** Lions club started running the famous Iowa State Fair shuttles in 1964, and continue to do so each year. Proud to call **Clearfield** home, the Lions Club proves to be a prominent feature within the small community, with many dedicated members.

Blockton

FAMOUS FOR: Taylor County Freedom Rock

Blockton was founded by the Mormons in 1861, and it was originally known as Mormontown. After the Mormons left the area, the Chicago Great Western Railway was built through the town and it was renamed **Blockton** in honor of W. T. Block, a railroad official.

Blockton is also home of the **Taylor County Freedom Rock**, painted by Ray "Bubba" Sorensen II. It was painted in 2014 as part of the Freedom Rock Tour of Iowa which aims to boost tourism and spread the message of thanking our Veterans while providing a uniqueness to their area. Freedom Rocs are located in all 99 counties in the great state of Iowa. Make sure to visit them on the web at www.thefreedomrock.com to see all locations!

Bedford, the county seat of Taylor County was founded in 1853, with the first sale of lots occurring in July of 1853.

Edwin Houck, the person considered the founder of Bedford wrote of the sale: "No person attended the sale except the farmers of the county. A barrel of whiskey was on the ground, and after they had drawn freely, the sale commenced, and most of the lots surveyed were sold at prices varying from ten to twenty dollars, but not a single lot was paid for, or title bond given, and if any record was kept of the sale, it is not to be found among the records of the county. However, to say that these sales were regarded by the parties concerned, as binding upon themselves, and were so treated in nearly every instance."

The first building was built by O.W. Fenno who built a double log cabin which served as his home and a hotel on the corner of Main and Water (Central) streets, now the site of the Ahrens Memory Garden. The second building was across the street south and belonged to Mr. Houck.

Four times in Bedford's history the town was challenged for the county seat. Lexington, which was located north of the Lake of Three Fires, felt that since they were more near the center of the county they should be the county seat. They were defeated in all their attempts.

In 1892, the old stone courthouse which was located at the present City Hall site was replaced by the beautiful courthouse we have today.

In 1909 Bedford saw one of it's greatest changes when mud streets were paved with brick. These same streets and all of the 12 block downtown area are now on the Historical Register.

Harness Racing

Each June, **Harness Racing** hits the track at the Taylor County Fairgrounds, where it was first featured in 1866. Since 1876, it is known as the best track in southwest Iowa and among the top five tracks in the entire state! Many of the Taylor County harness horses, owners, trainers and breeders have even been inducted into Iowa's Racing Hall of Fame!



Ladoga LaBlanche Orchard

Home of the "Little Red School House," Ladoga LaBlanche Orchard is the perfect place to take advantage of fresh apples and other produce. Homesteaded in 1875, the orchard is rich in history and welcomes school field trips or family gatherings. Tour the orchard and have a weenie roast, a hayride or a wedding...just make sure to enjoy your visit.







The Garland Hotel East Main Street | 712.523.3187

Bedford House, also known as the Garland Hotel, was built in three stages. The first section was completed in 1857 and additions were completed in 1877 and 1910. Charles Steele, a local businessman, farmer, and banker, had the structure built and was its first owner. The original hotel was used as a stage coach depot until the railroad came to Bedford in 1872. It suffered some damage in a fire that destroyed five other commercial buildings in 1877. Until 1880 the building also housed a jail in the cement fruit cellar. The hotel was renamed the Hotel Garland by its new owner John Clark in 1906. The building was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1977, and closed in 1997 after serving an estimated 150,000 guests. The 1910 addition collapsed in 2004, which almost caused the building to be torn down, however, it instead led to a community effort to save the building and the formation of the Garland Hotel Resoration Board.

Although not currently a functioning hotel, the beautifully furished building can be toured if an appointment is made. www.bedford.k12.ia.us | 712.523.2656

The **Bedford Community School Hall of Fame** was created during the 2015-2016 school year. A committee was formed with different members of the school system and representatives of the communities the hall of fame represents. The communities that make up the Bedford Community School District are Bedford, Blockton, Conway, Gravity, and New Market. Anyone who has connections to these schools that now make up the current Bedford Community School District are eligible for induction into the hall of fame.

What started more than 150 years ago continues to be THE summer event for Taylor County, Iowa. A group of citizens gathered to organize an Agricultural Society in Bedford, IA. A constitution and by-laws were drafted and in October of 1857, stock was issued. In 1865, a delegate was selected to meet with the State Agricultural Society in Des Moines...the **Taylor County Fair** had officially begun!

The Round Barn at the Taylor County Museum

Our signature attraction at the Museum is the Lenox **Round Barn**. In 2018 we are celebrating the 20th anniversary of the moving and restoration of the barn. It was built about 1907 by J.E. Cameron and was donated by his descendants, Dick and Evelyn (his granddaughter) Brammer. It was moved from south of Lenox, IA, to our site, nearly 20 miles away. The project started in late 1996 and was dedicated and placed on the National Register of Historic Places in May, 1998.

Project co-chairs and co-workers, Charles Dukes and Jim Parrish, led the formidable task of rescuing a great historical land mark. During an 18 month period, these two dedicated men and a host of volunteers, completed the daunting challenge of turning rubble into a prized treasure for Taylor County. Today the **Round Barn** stands as a majestic tribute to the vision, dedication, and gallant efforts of these Taylor County Heroes.

Charles Dukes lived in eastern Taylor county all of his adult life as a farmer and part time carpenter. Using his construction and engineering skills, combined with his passion for old barns, Charles led an army of volunteers and contractors in the dismantling, moving and reconstruction of the Round Barn.

James Parrish spent his early years on a farm just east of Gravity. He made his home in California until his retirement, when he returned to that same Taylor County farm. Jim negotiated the acquisition of the **Round Barn**, and worked tirelessly to secure the vast amount of funding necessary for its renovation.

The **Round Barn** has been the setting for many weddings and other special events. It's a favorite of our visitors, and many stop as they drive by to photograph this beautiful barn.

It sits atop a hill on our 4.08 acre site along Highway 2 at the northwest edge of Bedford. Nearby exhibits include: Rock Island Caboose, The Ladoga Depot, 1878 Log Cabin, The Hess Schoolhouse, Small Chapel, Original Bedford Jail from 1880, and our two main buildings.

The Museum is open daily Tuesday - Sunday from 1pm to 4pm and is operated by volunteers. There is no paid staff. Free will admission fee and donations are gladly accepted!

Lake of Three Fires STATE PARK



The Lake of Three Fires State Park could be best described as one of southwest Iowa's best kept secrets and it happens to be located just four short miles north of Bedford! Open year round, this is the ideal park for the outdoor enthusiast due to its wide range of activities that can be enyjoyed any time of year!

Camping

Whether you have a tent or an RV, the Lake of Three Fires is a must visit park for campers! In addition to the many primitive camp sites, you will find several electric sites nestled beneath the large trees providing lots of shade! Several of the campsites can be reserved in advance while others are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. The campgrounds also provide a dump station, fresh water supplies and showering facilities.

Cabins:

Six Family cabins are available at nightly or weekly rates. Each unfurnished cabin sleeps four people and is equipped with a full bathroom with shower, cook top, refrigerator, heating and a/c. Outside you will find lots of shade, a view of the lake, picnic tables and a grill!

Equestrian:

There is a separate campground dedicated to all things equestrian! Choose from electric or non-electric camping with either corrals, hitching posts or holding pens.

Trails:

Surrounding the Lake of Three Fires you will find 8 miles of marked trails. This provides a great opportunity to experience the lakes beauty year round through hiking, horseback riding or snowmobiling.

Hunting & Fishing:

On the north border of the park is a 220 acre public hunting area as well as a 160 acre public hunting area on the south border. Fishing boats are welcome (must be run at no-wake speed) and can be docked on the water.

Picnics:

There are two open picnic shelters that can be reserved. One has electricity and running water with a playground nearby. The Lodge, near the beach, is perfect for gatherings with indoor and outdoor capabilities, refrigerator and restrooms!

We were so excited when our first deer arrived. We had done it! We had ONE deer!

Flash forward 12 years, through God's grace and a lot of hard work, we are blessed to have two children, are surrounded by family and friends, and Zeb's Smokehouse has become more than we could have ever dreamed it to be. We are processing wild game from all over the country, serving hunters nationwide, selling our retail products in other stores, and we just expanded our services to become the first farm to table butcher in the state of lowa.

This has been our venture, but we use this opportunity to reach out and invite others to make Bedford their home. Bedford is a great place to call home and a wonderful place to raise a family. For those of you with an adventurous spirit, Bedford still holds a lot of potential and opportunity for new dreams to become reality. Bedford is historic, beautiful, and alive. Our community, our schools, our churches, and our businesses are full of people who are friendly and truly caring. Our parks are breathtaking and the serenity of Bedford is beyond words. People from all over the United States who visit the smokehouse will say the same comment to us, "this is God's country," and they are right.

AGRICULTURE



With some of the richest and most productive soil in the world, over 90 percent of its land used for agriculture, and a large amount of other agricultural advantages, it's no wonder lowa ranks second in the nation when it comes to ag production. Iowa is also second in total agricultural exports, with farmers exporting more than \$10 billion worth of ag products in 2013.

Iowa is the heart of the nation with 33 million acres of land divided into 97,000 farming units. The number of farms has declined to a little less than half the number that were in the state a half century ago. The land used for agriculture based industry has decreased by 1.5 million acres over the last five decades due to acres being converted into recreational and conservation areas, interstate highways or commercial and residential developments. About a quarter of a million of the 2.9 million lowa residents currently reside on farms... a mere one third of the the amount 50 years ago.

Like any other lowa community, agriculture is a common way of life for those who call Bedford home. While not all families live on a farm, every resident is familar with the sight of grazing cattle, the smell of fresh cut hay, and slow moving implements on the highway during the planting and harvest seasons.

If you have never experienced a harvest moon or breathtaking sunset over an Iowa corn field that has been recently combined...make sure to add it to your bucket list.
