The Church Building is Clean!



Ways to Connect

Many of our routines have been disrupted since the closing of events, buildings and schools. Physical distancing is the new norm and we, perhaps, have a little more time on our hands. I believe we can use this time as a blessing to ourselves and others. We often say, "If I only had the time". Well, this is our chance. Since it is so important that we keep in relationship with one another in creative way, try one of these:

- 1. Write a note to one of our shut-ins. A hand-written note says that they are not alone but are a valued member of our church family.
- 2. Use our Stop (what you're doing), Drop (into a comfortable position) and Pray at 10am everyday. God's Word says that the prayer of a believer is powerful and effective. Imagine what can happen when all of God's people pray together.
- 3. Make three (at least) phone calls a day. One to a close friend or family member that you can't be with at present. One to a church family member you haven't seen in a while. The third one can be anybody you want! Check in on them. Offer words of encouragement or laughter. Lighten their load. You will bless them and YOU will be blessed as well.
- 4. Check in with a person who is at a higher level of risk. Those who are older or someone who is immune-compromised. Ask if they need anything. Now is the time to be a gift to someone who has been a gift to others.
- 5. Put an inspirational quote on your Facebook page each day. You never know how far it will travel to the heart of others.
- 6. Make it a contest! Whoever reaches out to the most people by text or email and gets a response wins cake!
