

Claude EMS Suspended

Many residents of Armstrong County may not be aware that as of Saturday, June 3, 2017, Claude's Emergency Medical Services (EMS) have been suspended until further notice. According to Claude's Mayor, Bill Wood, the decision to suspend services was a difficult one. "We didn't close [ambulance services] because we wanted to," shared Wood. "We closed it, for what we hope, is the benefit of the people. We want it back open as soon as we can."

There are many versions of the events which ultimately led to the Mayor's call to temporarily close EMS. However, the intent was clear; to give the residents of Armstrong County who may be experiencing medical distress the best chance to receive timely care. At this time, 9-1-1 calls requiring ambulance response are being handled by Amarillo.

In the past, Armstrong County has received ambulance assistance from neighboring communities—including Panhandle. The increased reliance on these services has caused strain on these community relations. According to a letter from Terry Coffee, Mayor and City Manager of Panhandle, "Many of the calls your dispatch calls [Panhandle EMS] rather

than page your own service for fear of not having anyone there to answer." The reduced number of available, qualified volunteers to run the Claude Ambulance service has been a growing problem for the City of Claude. Coffee went on to say, "Panhandle EMS will no longer answer calls in [our] city." Panhandle EMS has a designated service area in Carson County and taking an ambulance out of that area to make calls in Armstrong County leaves them open to significant liability.

Services from Panhandle EMS will not resume unless the City of Claude or Armstrong County were to sign a contract with the service at a rate of \$2,000 per call. Coffee acknowledges the fact that if the city were indeed able to contract with Panhandle at that rate; it most likely could afford to maintain its own service. "You have a service that has been in the early years a model of the EMS community, yet because of lack of help and poor management of your service in the past it could put your citizens in dire straits," Coffee finished. He also urged the City and County to come together to find a solution to the EMS situation.

In an effort to find that solution, an unofficial meeting was held at City Hall on Thursday, June

8th, to discuss the current situation. The City, County, and Community all had representatives in attendance at the meeting. Although no official decisions were made at the meeting, a discussion was held as to what steps might be taken to resume ambulance service in Armstrong County as soon as feasibly possible. City Councilman, Dan Parks says, "This isn't going to be an overnight process. We need to figure out some kind of mutual agreement between the city and county to provide this necessary service." However, there is a sense of urgency surrounding this entire situa-

tion. Not only does a prolonged closure leave the citizens of Armstrong County without timely coverage, but it also has other consequences. "The longer we wait, the more we will end up paying other—more expensive—service, and the harder it will be to reestablish our own EMS."

Official discussions about EMS began on the city level at the City Council Meeting held on Monday, June 12th. Official discussions will begin with Armstrong County at the called Commissioners Court Meeting scheduled for Monday, June 26th. The resolution to this situation remains to be seen.



Solar Flares

Every now and then a tremendous explosion occurs on the sun releasing gas into the atmosphere. These are called **solar flares**.

Solar flares can affect radio and wireless communications millions of miles away on Earth and create light shows such as the Aurora Borealis or Northern Lights.

Sunspots

Sunspots are dark areas that appear on the surface of the sun. They are caused by strong magnetic activity within the sun. Sunspots can change size and move slowly across the surface of sun.



SLIP, SLOP, SLAP, SEEK and SLIDE

Kids in Australia learn at an early age the five steps to protecting their skin from the sun. They are:

SLIP

on some protective clothing like a T-shirt.

SLOP

on some sunscreen - SPF 30+.

SLAP

on a hat with a wide brim.

SEEK

some shade to get out of the sun's rays.

SLIDE

on a pair of sunglasses to protect your eyes.

Yeeouch!

If you forget to slip, slop, slap seek and slide, your skin can burn.

A sunburn can be very painful and is much like a burn from fire. Your skin will turn red and you may even get blisters. As the burned area heals, your skin peels, which can be very itchy.

How to Treat a Sunburn

- Take a cool bath or use wet cloths to cool down the burned part of your skin.
- Apply aloe gel or sprays for sunburned skin.
- Don't use soap, as this could dry and irritate your burned skin.
- IMPORTANT: if watery blisters appear on your skin, you should see your doctor.


