A typical cabin heater like this one draws 5 – 13 amps depending upon the setting. This heater could easily add an additional \$20 - \$40 onto your monthly power bill.

Payment Options

Did you know that there are three ways to pay your monthly marina bill?

You can come by or call the marina office and pay with check, credit card and cash. When you call, please have a credit or debit card ready. Please rest assured in knowing that we do not write your card number down, we enter it into the credit card machine as you tell us the number.

Another way to make your payment is to mail or drop off your payment at City Hall. Please be sure to write your marina account number on your check.

The last way is by an automatic withdrawal from your checking account. The payment is taken from your checking account on the 15th of each month. If you select this option, come by the office with a voided check and complete the form.

Fill your water tanks

The weather over the last month has been wet, windy and a little snowy. We have been somewhat lucky in the sense that it has not gotten very cold.

Those of us that have lived in this area for a long time know that we get a certain amount of cold weather every year and it is not the easiest thing to predict. Basically we know that cold weather is out there and will eventually find its way to us.

Just a reminder, many of our water lines are made out of PVC and tend to freeze and break during sub-freezing weather. Because of this, staff will evacuate many of the water lines in the marina when sub-freezing temperatures are forecasted.

If you rely on marina water, staff recommends that you keep your water tanks topped off, so that when it does freeze and the water is turned off you have water for your use.
