All skill levels, ages, and experience are welcome! We will have breakfast and lunch and CHM will provide the building materials.



Consistent with the St. Marks Church Mission, our goal is to Reach Out to our community by sharing the love of Jesus Christ. We want to "Connect" people with Jesus, with each other and with our church.

We've been a busy group! We've recently, in conjunction with our trustees and administrative board, acquired a 15 person (including accommodations for 2 wheelchairs) Church Bus! We held a "naming and graphics" contest and received over 20 submissions! Since every single one of the ideas submitted is "a winner", the committee chose to use a mixture of all of them. Be on the lookout sometime in April for the completed words & graphics on the bus. The plan is to not only use this bus for fellowship trips, but to do lots of ministry. Please check with your group to see where you need group transportation to be the hands, feet and heart of Jesus Christ! (NOTE: to use the bus, we have a current list of 10 trained/qualified drivers. It's up to the group to secure one of those folks to drive them to & from their chosen event/location. That list is available in the church office). In order to use the bus, there must be a minimum of 5 people (including the driver). The only exception will be it's use for picking up folks to attend our Sunday church services. The bus can be reserved via the church office. The policy is "first come, first served" in reserving the bus for your group. The Outreach & Connection Committee are the managers of the bus calendar and procedures, in conjunction with our trustees.



East-End Neighborhood Association

The East-End Neighborhood Association (EENA) was incorporated in October 1990, after its beginning efforts in 1987. Its mission is to improve the quality of life for those who live, work, do business or worship there. They undertake multiple, simultaneous initiatives to improve the quality of life in their neighborhood. The population residing there is very diverse; composed of African-American, Hispanic and Caucasian residents. The majority of the households are low to moderate income. At the most recent count, the area consists of 520 households, 85 businesses, 5 churches and comprises 8 to 10% of Easton's total population. The rental at 65 to 70% vs. homeownership rate is very high. EENA is almost entirely within Easton's historic district; presenting opportunities but also challenges.

Their annual and ongoing activities include: Spring Cleanup and Beautification Day, collaboration with the Easton Police to reduce neighborhood crime, monitoring local housing conditions & advocating for housing codes, streetlight and sidewalk survey, sponsoring an annual fall community dinner and membership meeting, managing & maintaining the EENA Community Garden, monitoring planning & zoning issues and responding to threats arising from unintended consequences of town or county actions, support for The Hill Project, support for the Chesapeake Multicultural Resource Center, and coordination with the Town of Easton Planning Department on local area comprehensive planning update efforts.

EENA was the recipient of the State of Maryland Governor's Outstanding Neighborhood Award in 1994 and in 2011 their garden was named a "Pearl" in the Eastern Shore Land Conservancy String of Pearls project. Some of the results of their work include securing funding & Town of Easton cooperation to create a permanent land trust for the community garden, safety & accessibility of sidewalks improved, code enforcement—rental inspection program did not exists prior to EENA advocating for this program, substantial crime reduction from physical environment improvements including additional & improved lighting, increased bike & street patrols and more activities for youth, etc., etc., etc.

St. Mark's Church through our mission fund has provided a small donation each year to the East-End Neighborhood Association for as long as I have been on the missions committee; approximately fourteen years. I also know of the association because Herby and I have been a dues paying member (now \$10. a year) since Herby was on the county council. If you would like to know more about the EENA, I would be glad to show you all the information they gave me that is too long to include here. And they do all this with no paid staff; it's all volunteer work.
