As I was driving back from Oxford (YES...it was an Ice Cream run!) last week, I read a bumper sticker that simply said "Bible: **B**asic **I**nformation **B**efore **L**eaving **E**arth." I like that. The Bible is God's basic information about what is right, wrong, good, and evil, real and false, temporary or eternal. If you follow the instructions of God's word, you will never lose your way. I love the Bible. It is God's love letter to me and you.

This morning as I sit in my church office I see the picture of my Mom (I mention this because Mother's Day is coming up) and I give thanks to God for my parents and their marriage. The picture I am looking at is the picture she gave my Dad over seventy years ago. She wrote on this picture, "Lovingly yours, Martha". 



International Organ Competition in Miami, Florida

Our Organist, Bill Wharton, along with some 600 other people, attended the 2019 Miami International Organ Competition on Feb. 22nd. This ninth annual international competition was sponsored by the organ builder Fratelli Ruffatti of Padua, Italy & the Church of the Epiphany. The organ event is "intended to encourage & recognize talented young organists under the age of thirty" & offers four prizes ranging from \$500 to \$5,000 to winners who are judged under professional musical competition rules.

Some thirty applicants from all over the world sent preliminary recordings of their playing to a panel of judges. From that group another semi-final round judges choose three finalists. During the Feb. $22^{\rm nd}$ performance, the finalist judges (two American & one Italian) were hidden behind a curtain so as not to see but only hear the players' performances. Each contestant was given 25 minutes to demonstrate their talents & skills. Moreover, the three performers had different individual styles of how to play their musical selections & how they approached using the organ.

The finalists included Tyler Boehmer from America who won first place, Joseph Russell from Canada who won second prize, & Ilaria Centorrino from Italy who won the third & audience prizes. A unique feature of the competition was the audience being allowed to vote for its favorite player!


The Fratelli Ruffatti Organ at Epiphany is very similar to the organ at St. Mark's in size & style except that the Fuffatti is located entirely in the balcony & sounds directly into a highly reverberant acoustical space. Most unusual is the "oval egg-like" design of the organ case which helps project the sound into the huge church space.
