Last week I was reading my daily devotion on my phone (yes, I said <u>phone</u>...old dogs can learn new tricks!) I was really taken back and thank God for his timing. This devotion was so awesome that I wanted to share it with everyone! The scripture was this:

# With my understanding; I will sing with my spirit, but I will also sing with my understanding 1Corinthians 14:15

Then the devotional posed a question to think about, which went like this: In one church the piano is out of tune, the sound system buzzes, the hymnals are dog-eared, and few in the congregation can sing on key. In another church, the building is an historic treasure, the choir is robed, singing is accompanied by organ and an orchestra, and the service moves with flawless precision. The question they asked was; In which church is worship taking place? The choices are: Either or neither or both. Why?

This made me stop and really ponder and I realized I cannot answer that question! The reason I struggled to answer was God's timing, was God's teaching this old dog another new trick? A few weeks ago at our 8:15 service, I felt the Holy Spirit say to me don't preach today, just pray as a church family. I have to tell you I struggled because church (in my mind) was to move in flawless precision according to the bulletin. (Oh, I still have far to go at times!) Who knows what would have happened if I was obedient to that thought placed on my heart? Your Pastor fell short that day. (I am being real with you)

So when I read this devotion, I needed to be reminded (again) that true worship is led by the Holy Spirit, and when it is, it will be beneficial to all God's children. It is not about a buzzing sound system, singing in tune, or following the bulletin. Worshipping God, wherever we are, only goes as far as we allow the Holy Spirit to lead us. He leads us in many ways, for example through God's Word, Songs of Praise, and preaching. We must continue to open ourselves up to accept the insight and understanding he provides us. What is needed most during worship is that we prepare ourselves to meet God. We must come before God with open hearts and seek His presence on a daily basis. This happens at home, or whatever kind of church we attend.

I am coming to realize that no amount of education, natural gifts, or refinement is going to help us worship God better. What is needed most in every believer is a fresh anointing of the Holy Spirit. Jesus said when He left this earth, He will send the Holy Spirit to teach every believer everything we need to know and to remember. It is our openness to the Holy Spirit that will make a difference in our lives and the life of our church.
