We have been talking about engaging or reengaging our church & faith the last several weeks at St. Marks UMC. As we talk about our faith I am reminded of what Isaiah 48 says, "The grass withers and the flower fades, but the word of God stands forever." I think that is good news. Fads, feelings, books, people, cultures, ideas, notions, nations, opinions, money, stuff, markets all come & go. They do not last. They are changing all the time. Building your life on that kind of stuff is like building your house on sand. Only the truths of God are eternal, unchangeable, the same yesterday, today, & forever. Building your life on God's word is like building on a rock, solid, secure, eternal. The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God stands forever. That is good news when things are falling apart around you. I seems this year has not started off well for some in our congregation, lots of illness, personal struggles & hospitalizations. I love stories because they have a powerful way to draw us in, & make a point. That is why Jesus used them to teach. Here is one I came across that has become my "CURRENT" favorite.

There was an elderly man who lived on a farm way back in the mountains of Kentucky with his young grandson. Every morning the grandfather was up early reading from his old worn-out Bible. His grandson wanted to be like his granddad & tried to imitate him every way he could, & one day he said to his grandfather, "I try to read the Bible just like you, but I don't understand it, & what I do understand I seem to forget as soon as I close the book. What good does reading the Bible do?" The grandfather was putting coal in their wood burning stove, & he said, "Take this coal basket down to the river & bring back a basket of water." The boy did as he was told even though all of the water leaked out of the basket before he could get back. The grandfather said, "Well, I guess you are just going to have to run faster next time," & sent him back to the river with the basket to try again. The boy ran faster, but still all the water leaked out before he got back. He was frustrated, but his grandfather told him, "You go try one more time." He did, but the water was gone by the time he got to the house. The boy said, "Granddaddy, this is useless." The grandfather said, "Look at the basket." The boy looked at the basket, & for the first time he realized the basket looked different. Instead of the black on the inside from the dirty coal it was clean & spotless. The water had washed the inside. The grandfather said, "Son, that is what happens when you read the Bible. You might not understand it or remember everything, but when you read it & believe it & stand on it, it will change you from the inside out."

In the times in which we live our culture is trying everything possible to persuade you to doubt God's word. We are in times when Christians are being beheaded because of their belief in God. I encourage you to continue to trust the wisdom of the infinite God over the limitations of human intellect. I believe that everything that we need to know for great living, for handling life's difficulties, for making wise choices, for knowing what is right & what is wrong is found in God's word. You can choose to reject it, ignore it, criticize it, & not read it. You can say it is old fashioned & out of date, but perhaps our daily prayer should be Psalm 119:73, "You made me, you created me, now give me the good sense to follow your instructions." Remember, "The grass withers and the flower fades, but the word of God will stand forever."



June Billman: Pastor of Visitation

St. Mark's is blessed to have a Care Team of people, led by Pastor June Billman, who visit congregation members and their families in their homes, hospitals, nursing homes, and hospice. According to June Billman, Pastor of Visitation at St. Mark's, it takes a village to care for those in need. The team, led by Billman support Pastor Ed Kuhling, who also provides hospital visits and other visits upon request. She comments, "This is a wonderful mission that the church provides and we want everyone to get visited."

In addition to personal visits, the volunteer Care Team, which includes Marilyn Morris, Barbara Freidman, Cindy Brinsfield, Paula Trevor, Selina Moore, and Sharon Maisano, also provides phone calls and cards to those in need. During the past three-

month period, the Care Team has provided 145 visits. The team is trained and upholds the confidentiality of all members who are visited. This is the second year that June has been in her position. Pastor Missy Rekitzke asked her to consider the position in 2018. Reverend Gil Anderson, a retired pastor, was the previous Pastor of Visitation. According to June, Reverend Anderson trained her and gave her the springboard to do the job. Pastor Ed Kuhling initiated the Care Team component of the program. The paid position requires 10 hours a week.

She reflects, "It is so rewarding to sit down and talk to people and see them begin to smile again when you visit. Giving them just a portion of my time. It feels good to be there for other people."

June likes to quote Teddy Roosevelt who said, "People don't care how much you know **until** they know how much you care."


In addition to personal visits, June also presides over celebrations of life and funerals upon request and is available for end-of-life visits.

June is currently pastor of Oxford United Methodist Church. Prior to joining the ministry, she had 35 years of experience in customer service at Cadmus Communications/CENVEO, Inc. and at Preston Trucking Co., Inc. She has an Associate Degree in Allied Health from Chesapeake College and is currently pursuing a Course of Study Certificate from Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington DC. Local licensed pastors (who have completed 80 hours of licensing school) are required to complete 20 courses at the seminary.
