Sand Ceremony

As I stand in this beautiful place and look out over the landscape, I am in awe of the forces of nature that have sculpted it over the eons. The force of the wind and the waves, the gravitational pull of the moon, thunderstorms and hurricanes each in their turn have exerted a measurable force of transformation. And today we are here to recognize and celebrate a force which is even greater than any of those.

Love is a force more formidable than any other. It cannot be seen or measured, yet it is powerful enough to transform you in a moment, and offer you more joy than any material possession ever could. But although this love joins you together as one, remember the gift of your individuality. Cherish and affirm your differences as you love each other. To symbolize the importance of each of you within the marriage and the joining of your two lives into one, 3 colors of sand will now be combined in a sand ceremony.

First, we will pour sand from this beautiful beach, where Jenna and Eric stand committing their lives to each other, representing the strong foundation of their relationship. Then Eric and Jenna will each separately pour their sand into the vase, symbolizing who they are as individuals. Then, they will pour together, blending their two colors as a symbol of their joining together forever in love. Lastly, I will add another layer of beach sand, representing you, their community, supporting them in their marriage and holding them in love. Though the vase may be moved around, and the colors may shift and blend in new ways, the grains of sand cannot be separated.

They will remain joined in a harmonious whole. May your love be as eternal and as inseparable as this sand.
