The third annual Series of Fortunate Events (SOFE) consists of four events between April 25 and May 4, 2019, celebrating living with different abilities and showcasing the talents of artists with different abilities. *Performance Done Our Way* will feature live accessible music, theatre and dance performances. Arts Access invites you to submit a proposal for a **short play, excerpt of a play/musical, a monologue, or live music performance**. 2 theatre pieces and 2 musical performers will be curated by the Arts Access Board of Directors from applications. Submission Criteria:

- Set-up & performance must be no longer than 10 minutes in length – limited costumes and props.
- Theatre and Musical acts can be solo or ensemble; **actors must be off book**.
- Ensembles featuring or including actors with disabilities are welcome.
- Original works with themes of disability are encouraged.
- Must have rights to dramatic work performed or permission from the author in writing.
- Ability to send a video of a full rehearsal of your act 2 weeks before the event for audio describers and interpreters.
- Musicians must bring their own tracks, instruments, or accompanists.
