### Post-Graduate Programs

Each post-graduate program incorporates 45 credit hours that can be accumulated by taking 5 courses and writing a doctoral dissertation worth 30 credit hours (*150 pages requirement for the Doctor of Ministry Degree and 200 pages requirement for the Doctor of Philosophy Degree*).

#### Entrance Requirements

**First Level Doctoral Degrees:** To enter LICU's post-graduate studies at the first level of doctoral degrees (*Doctor of Ministry*) the student is expected to have earned a master's degree from a recognised institution. The degree needs to be within the



theological major that you are looking to pursue (*levelling courses might be required to cover LICU's core-course program*). Please see your campus director for more information.

**Second Level Doctoral Degrees:** To enter LICU's post-graduate studies at the second level of doctoral degrees (*Doctor of Philosophy*) the student is expected to have completed one of LICU's 45 credit hour doctoral programs and have completed a minimum of ten years of full-time ministry.

### Doctor of Ministry Study Program

**The Doctor of Ministry Study Program** is designed to complement the student's active involvement in ministry and to give them fundamental life tools as well as challenge them to reach for their full potential that has been deposited into them. Each track incorporates syllabuses concentrated around that particular major.

**Definition:** *The Doctor of Ministry (D.Min.) degree is, according to The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada (ATS), a doctoral level degree oriented toward ministerial leadership often in an area of applied theology, such as missions, evangelism, church leadership, pastoral psychology or the psychology of religion, church growth, church administration, homiletics, or spiritual formation* [<http://en.wikipedia.org>].

### Doctor of Philosophy Study Program

**The Doctor of Philosophy Study Program** is a capstone to all previous academic degrees. It signifies not only that the student has proven a great commitment and yieldedness to the continuous study of the Word of God but also it represents the most prestigious accomplishment in a student's educational endeavour.

**Definition:** *Doctor of Philosophy, usually abbreviated as PhD, Ph.D., DPhil or D.Phil. (for the Latin philosophiae doctor or doctor philosophiae), in English-speaking countries, abbreviated as Dr. Phil. or similar in several other countries, is a postgraduate academic degree awarded by universities. The academic level of degrees known as doctorates of philosophy varies considerably according to the country, institution and time period, from entry-level research degrees to higher doctorates* [<http://en.wikipedia.org>].
