**Our 2019 Lenten Midweek Series is entitled:
“A Lent to Remember”**

As people get older, they sometimes find themselves writing lists of important things that need to be remembered. Throughout the Scriptures, God’s people are told many times how important it is for them to remember—to remember His wonderful works on their behalf and to recall all that He has done for previous generations. In the liturgy we speak and the hymns we sing, we are using treasures entrusted to us by former generations. They contain words and ways that God’s people in the past used to help them remember all that God has done. God grant that we find blessing in sharing that remembering!

We will again have a Lenten pulpit exchange for our Midweek services. Neighboring pastors from our sister congregations will be involved in the leading of the services. Therefore, the themes presented below with not necessarily be in the order listed. However, these are the themes we will consider for Midweek Lent.

1. Ash Wednesday: Remember Dust, *Psalms 103:13–14*
2. Lenten Midweek 2: Remember Wondrous Works, *Psalms 111:4*
3. Lenten Midweek 3: Remember Jesus’ Words, *Luke 22:61–62*
4. Lenten Midweek 4: Remember the Covenant, *Psalms 105:8*
5. Lenten Midweek 5: Remember Sins No More, *Jeremiah 31:34*
6. Lenten Midweek 6: Remember Steadfast Love, *Psalms 98:3*
7. Maundy Thursday: Remembrance of Me, *1 Corinthians 11:23–26*
8. Good Friday: Remember Me, *Luke 23:39–43*
9. Easter Day: Remember Jesus Risen, *2 Timothy 2:8, 11*
