### **DRESS CODE 2019 – 2020**

There was confusion at the start of the school year concerning the dress code. The majority of the confusion centered on leggings/form fitting clothing and the required length of the top. The Board of Christian Education clarified that if form fitting leggings/ pants are worn, the top must cover to mid-thigh. This means all the way around and not just having the bottom covered.

This interpretation of the Dress Code will begin with the 2019-2020 school year. I am a firm believer that families want to comply with all school policies. We want to provide plenty of notice prior to the start of next school year so you can plan accordingly. ### **PICK-UP AND DROP OFF PROCEDUARES CHANGING**

Have you noticed the pink lines on the curbs along Locust and North Pine street? Those are markings the City of Reedsburg made to identify the 2019-2020 Bus Zone and Car Line areas. Next school year the Pine Street entrance will be used for all Bus loading and unloading. The Locust street entrance will be used for the Car Line. The Car Line is for families who prefer to drop off and pick up their children without getting out of the car. The parking lot will be used exclusively by families who wish to park and walk their children into and out of the building. This change is being made to provide a safer procedure for students and their families at the start and end of the day. More details will be coming in August.

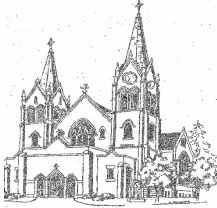
### **LUMBERJACK SHOW**

## WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE AN ACTIVE MEMBER OF ST. PETER'S LUTHERAN CHURCH??



The St. Peter's School Handbook encourages all families to attend church 50% of the time.

This is a very important part of determining member and non-member tuition at St. Peter's School. Member tuition rates will be charged based on the following guidelines:

- 50% church attendance at **St. Peter's Church** August 1 – July 31, of the following year, member tuition rate will apply. If attendance of 50% or greater has not been met, non-member rates will be charged for the following school year.

Church attendance will be reviewed August 1st of each year to determine your tuition rate for the upcoming school year. Attendance will be recorded from attendance cards at church. You have received your church attendance information quarterly throughout the school year. This information will also be included in your child's final report card. If you find a discrepancy in the numbers, please contact the school office.
