THE WORD THIS WEEK



We spool forward a few centuries in the story of the Old Testament, to arrive at Abraham, "our Father in faith". To-

day we hear of another Covenant (like last week) - even though the word is not used. God promises Abraham descendants like "the stars of heaven", and the showering of blessings. This shows how much God loves Abraham, and all his children. This love is proved for us in Jesus: God loves us so much he sacrificed his only Son (just as Abraham was willing to do); but this is not all: Jesus also rose from the dead, to stand at God's right hand and plead for us. All this is revealed in the story of the Transfiguration, where Jesus is seen in

until after the Resurrection will the disciples see this fully again.

PRAYER

Try and find a little extra time for **PRAYER** in Lent – don't worry about what to say or do, just sit quietly with the Lord Jesus in your mind and thoughts. If you are looking for something specific, the Stations of the Cross are very useful: take one of the sheets in the Atrium and use it sitting in the car or on the bus or at home! Alternatively this year we will be celebrating the Stations of the Cross together at 12.00 noon on Wednesdays. Everyone is very welcome.

AID TO THE CHURCH IN NFFN

This year's Lenten Charity in Church is **Aid to the Church in** Need, a Catholic charity which helps Christians and others throughout the world who

are persecuted for their faith: a big focus of ACN's work is the Christian community of the Holy Land, which occupies our thoughts so much in this Season! Examples of ACN's work are supporting Christian refugees from Syria, priests and nuns working in India, and rebuilding homes in Iraq. PENANCE

Every Catholic is required to go to confession at least once a year, preferably in the period between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday (27th May). This may seem challenging, but this too is an opportunity: have a think about the direction of your life, perhaps about the habits and other things you take for granted. Be confident that you will be received in the confessional with patience, help and kindness - this Sacrament is all about the love and mercy of God, helping us onward and upward on the journey of Christian life. See this annual confession as you spiritual MOT! Confessions are on Saturdays 11-30-12 Noon [except first Saturdays] and 6.00-6.15 pm.


NEXT WEEK'S GOSPEL



Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up

to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the moneychangers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said. During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

HARD OF HEARING? There is an Induction Loop System installed in this Church: if you wear a hearing aid, please turn it to the 'T' setting.

WHEELCHAIR spaces are available on the left side of church, near the back, near the statue of Our Lady and at the top end by the emergency exit.

REFRESHMENTS AFTER MASS

Everyone is very welcome to stay behind after Mass and share a cuppa! Tea and Coffee are served in the Atrium straight after all Masses.

TOILETS

Ladies and Gents are located in the Atrium: we also have disabled facilities with a baby change unit. Please leave toilets clean and tidy after use. Thank you.

The **PARISH OFFICE** is open Tuesday & Thursday (8.00-12 Noon) Friday 08.00—11.30 but please check in advance if you intend to call in. Father James is not available on Mondays: in an emergency please contact a neighbouring Parish.

THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISMS are by appointment: please collect one of the Information forms from the porch for details of what is required and the next steps in the process.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK please call the Presbytery to ask for this Sacrament. It should not be left until the last minute, but the sick should celebrate this sacrament to receive God's help, healing and comfort.

MARRIAGE is by appointment. Please take an information leaflet, and return the tear off portion to arrange a pre-Nuptial interview. Please do not make bookings before this interview, and note that six months' notice is required (exceptions cannot be made to this.)

CHILDREN'S LITURGY

At every Sunday Mass we offer the Children's Liturgy of the Word. This is for children of Primary School age (i.e. who have started in Reception): they start Mass with their families and friends, and then will be invited by the priest to go out with leaders into the Atrium, where they will listen to and reflect on the Bible readings before joining us again for the second half of Mass.

CHILDRENS' CHAPEL

Through the round window in Church you can see the Children's Chapel, a space specially designed for pre-school children, to allow them (and their families) to relax a little during Mass. The room is soundproof, so the odd bit of noise in there won't disturb anyone! When you take the children in, please help them to have an experience of being at church, using the books and toys provided, and following the Mass. Please ensure that children are not left unaccompanied in the Chapel, and please leave it tidy for the next Mass. To get into the Children's Chapel, go through the door in the corner of the Atrium.
