
Boise is home to many things. From urban living to outdoor activities you can always find something to do. With friendly people and a mild climate, Boise and the surrounding communities provides ample quality of life. The Treasure Valley is beautifully nestled against our foothills. Our metropolitan area which contains five counties and the state's three largest cities; Boise, Nampa and Meridian has an overall population of 616,500.

Boise has a semi-arid climate with four seasons. Boise has hot and dry summers that reaches triple digits (over 100 degrees) at least eight days in a typical year and 90 degrees roughly 51 days. Winters are moderately cold. December average of 30 degrees, and lows falling to 0 degrees or below approximately 3 nights per year. Snowfall averages 19 inches, but typically falls in bouts of 3 inches or less. Typically melting by the afternoon. Spring and fall are very mild with temperatures averaging around 60 degrees. Precipitation is usually infrequent and light, especially so during the summer months. Average amount of rainfall in Boise is 11.6 inches a year.

Boise History

Nestled on a high desert plain in the shadow of the Rocky Mountains with a pristine river flowing through its center, Boise finds its roots from the gold rush days of the 1800s. In 1834 Fort Boise, owned by the Hudson Bay Company, was established by British fur traders. The fort, now known as Old Fort Boise, was located at the mouth of the Boise River, 40 miles from present day Boise. In 1854, due to frequent Indian raids, the fort was abandoned. Despite this, the military desired to build another fort in the area, but, before this plan could go into effect, gold was discovered in the Boise Basin in 1862. It was now necessary, more than ever, to protect the vast number of travelers coming to the area.

On July 4, 1863, the military chose a location for the new Fort Boise and construction began soon afterward. A town site was located next to the fort, and with the protection of the military, the town grew quickly. A major reason for this growth, other than the gold rush, was its location along the Oregon Trail.

The Oregon Trail was a thoroughfare for thousands of travelers heading for the Oregon Territory. Of all the western roads, the Oregon Trail was the longest at 2,020 miles. It began in Independence, Missouri and ended at Oregon City, Oregon. Its route in Idaho began at the Idaho-Wyoming border, crossed through Bear Valley, turned north toward Fort Hall and then followed the Snake River until it reached the Boise River. It followed the south side of the river winding through what is now the southern part of Boise. To this day, wheel ruts can still be seen along some areas of its path.

Adding to this major thoroughfare were the routes to the Boise Basin and Owyhee mines. These routes crossed the Oregon Trail at the Fort Boise location. Because it was located at these major crossroads, Boise became a prosperous commercial center.

In 1864, when the territorial legislature held its second session in Lewiston, Boise was incorporated as a city and proclaimed the capital of the Idaho Territory. This same year, on July 26, the Idaho Statesman newspaper produced its first publication and became the second newspaper in Idaho. The first was the Idaho World in Idaho City.

After the gold rush, Boise's population declined from 1,658 citizens in 1864 to 995 in 1870. With new construction, including the territorial prison in 1869 and the U.S. Assay Office in 1872, Boise

began to grow again. The capitol building was completed in 1886 and in 1887 Boise built a streetcar system. In 1890, Idaho became a state.

In the early 1900s Boise once again enjoyed rapid growth. This growth came with the expansion of irrigation in the valley in 1902. This led to the construction of Arrowrock Dam, the tallest in the world from 1915 to 1932.

In the late 1930s, Boise was graced with the massive migration of Basques from their native home in the Western Pyrenees Mountains. These proud people became sheepherders, a large industry at the time, and gradually moved into the mainstream of city life in Boise, bringing their colorful culture with them.


Today Boise has the largest concentration of Basques per capita outside the Pyrenees Mountains.

As the Great Depression ravaged many cities in the nation, Boise enjoyed growth. And during World War II, multitudes of airmen trained at Gowen Field, Boise's air base.

Today Boise is still the largest metropolitan community in the state with over 616,561 residents in the greater metropolitan area. Numerous international, national, regional and state corporations have their headquarters or a large presence in Boise. Some of these include Boise (formerly Boise Cascade), J.R. Simplot Company, Albertsons/SuperValu, Micron and URS Corporation's Washington Division. Boise is the hub of commerce, banking and government for the state and is located midway between Salt Lake City, UT and Portland, OR.

Neighborhoods

According to the United States Census Bureau, Boise occupies a large area of 64 square miles. It is composed of several neighborhoods. These include West Boise, Boise Bench, North Boise, East Boise, South Boise, Southeast Boise, North End and Downtown. Other suburbs include Meridian, Eagle, Garden City, Kuna & Star. These all make up what is known as Ada County.

West Boise

West Boise is where you will find the Boise Towne Square Mall, the largest in the state. There are numerous restaurants in West Boise along with strip malls and residential developments ranging from new subdivisions to apartment complexes. You will also find Ada County jail, DMV and Hewlett Packard's printing division. It is centrally located and you can get to any section of Boise in relatively good time. West Boise also borders the city of Meridian and Garden City.

Boise Bench

The Bench sits on an elevation approximately 60 feet higher than downtown Boise to its northeast. Orchard Street is a major north-south thoroughfare. The Bench is so named because this sudden rise, giving the appearance of a step or bench. There are actually three benches in the Boise Valley. It was created as an ancient shoreline to the old river channel. The Bench is home to the Boise Union Pacific Depot and older residential neighborhoods similar to those in the North End. Just south of the Bench is the Boise Airport.

North Boise

North Boise or Northwest Boise sits tucked against the Boise Foothills to the north. Eagle sits to the west and downtown Boise to the east. It contains a mix of old and new neighborhoods, including Lakeharbor which features the private Silver Lake, a reclaimed quarry. Along with the new Quinns Pond where many people enjoy paddle boarding and swimming. Veteran's Memorial Park provides easy access onto the Greenbelt that follows the Boise River from Lucky Peak Reservoir all the way into Star.

East Boise

Home to the Idaho Shakespeare Festival and Lucky Peak Reservoir. Barber Park is where you can get in the Boise River to float all the way down to Ann Morrison Park. You will also find St. Luke's Hospital and Warm Springs Blvd. Warm Springs Blvd is a historic street lined with trees and contains some of Boise's largest and most expensive homes (many of them built by wealthy minder and businessmen from the 20th century) also once known as Barber Town. Featuring Victorian style homes they are sure to wow you. The area gets its name from the natural hot springs that flow from Boise's fault line which in turn warms many of the homes in the area. You will also find the Natatorium public swim center, the Old Penitentiary in which you can take a tour of. Another must do is the Idaho Botanical Gardens and a hike up to Table Rock.

South Boise

South Boise contains sparsely populated neighborhoods built from the 1960s to the early 80s. Many include large lots starting from an acre and the occasional farmhouse and pasture. In the 1980s, growth in the area was stunted to prevent urban sprawl. Since this has been lifted there has been widespread growth of new development in new homes. You will also find the Idaho Birds of Prey and the Edwards Theater

Neighborhoods Continued

Southeast Boise

Southeast Boise spans from Boise State University to Micron Technology. The older area just south of the University can also be described as the Boise Bench. The rest of Southeast Boise was developed in the last thirty years with suburban-style homes. Columbia Village subdivision and Oregon Trail Heights were the first major planned communities in Southeast Boise with an elementary and middle school all within walking distance from all the homes. The subdivision also has a baseball complex, swimming pools and the Simplot Sports complex. Eight more new subdivisions are planned to be built out there.

North End

The North End contains many of the city's oldest homes. It is known for its tree-lined drives such as Harrison Blvd, and for its quiet neighborhoods near the downtown area. Downtown Boise is visible from Camel's Back Park. On 13th Street is home to Hyde Park. Known for its Restaurants and Beatnik atmosphere. The North End also hosts events such as the annual Hyde Park Street Fair. Access to Bogus Basin Ski Resort is also off of Harrison Blvd.

Downtown

Downtown Boise is Boise's cultural center and home to many small business and a few mid-rises. While downtown isn't like Seattle or Portland in having major retail or dining it does have a variety of shops and is a growing option for dining choices. 8th Street contains a pedestrian zone sidewalk cafes and restaurants. During the summer they host Alive After 5. The neighborhood has a number of bars, boutiques and supports a vibrant nightlife. The area contains the Basque Block in which you can learn about the Basque heritage. Downtown Boise's main attractions include the Idaho State Capitol, the classic Egyptian Theatre, the Boise Art Museum, The Boise Public Library, Julia Davis Park and the Boise Zoo. You will also find Boise State University. Known for its blue turf football field. The Albertsons Stadium at BSU seats 37,000 and is home to the Boise State Broncos football team coached by Boise native Bryan Harsin. Other cultural and sports centers in the area include the Velma V Morrison Center for the Performing Arts and Taco Bell Arena.





LOCAL MTN BIKE TRAILS

01

BALLINGER FLAT TRAIL | MOUNTAIN HOME | 0.6MI ●

A short side trip past a spring to overlook the South Fork Boise River with access from Danskin Trail #340. The view from the canyon rim is well worth the ride.

02

THE WASH TRAIL | EMMETT | 1.6MI ●

This trail runs down "The Wash" from East Perimeter Trail down to Little Gem Service Road with hundreds of options to ride other connecting trails up both sides of the valley. Though most are quite steep and slick, hidden gems await your discovery.

03

AROUND THE MOUNTAIN | BOISE | 9.8MI ■

A great loop around Bogus Basin Ski Resort with amazing views all the way to Sawtooths and down into Boise. Moderate climbs, great berms and fast descents. The trail is well marked and connects to many other trails to create many other options.

04

THUNDER MONKEY | BOISE | 15.6MI ■

Beautiful alpine ride through MTB country with climbs, breathtaking descents, wood and stone features, and excellent backcountry single track. Connect the Shafer Butte system with Mahalo and Dry Creek. *Note: This is a shuttle ride unless you're into pedaling up 14 miles back to the ski area on Bogus Basin road after the descent.*

05

GREENHORN GULCH ADVENTURE | KETCHUM | 22.6MI ■

A stunning western landscape with narrow singletrack and a riot of springtime wildflowers. An excellent destination for eMTBing located just south of Sun Valley, ID. The majority of the trails in the network are open to eMTBs, allowing for multiple loops that vary from 30 minutes to all day.

06

BB BOMBER | BOISE | 27.3MI ■

A great shuttle run that will take you through the vast pines of Bogus Basin, past iconic Stack Rock and finish up on an open, flowing single track. *Note: Dogs may be allowed off-leash on this trail.*

07

TABLE ROCK TECH | BOISE | 3.6MI ♦

One of the best ways to experience the rocky trails in the Boise area. This ride starts from the top of Table Rock and can either be shuttled, or you can climb one of the numerous trails in the Table Rock system to its start. *Note: Dogs may be allowed off-leash on this trail.*

08

THE BIG POTATO | BOISE | 41MI ♦

The earliest this trail can be accessed is in Mid to Late May, depending on snow conditions. This ride is one of the best ways to experience the foothills outside of Boise. *Note: Be prepared with food and water as Simplot lodge is the only stop along the way that may have access to supplies.*

09

COYOTE CLASSIC RACE COURSE | EAGLE | 48MI ♦

This is the 2012 Race Course that tours some of the best single track and views in the Avimor trail system. *Note: You'll find cows grazing in some of the more remote areas so please be aware of your surroundings.*




