THE LINK ROOM



Welcome to the Link Room!

The Link Room, built between 1991 and 1992, was provided by the generosity of the congregation of St Matthias Church and other supporters of the Link Room Appeal to be a valuable resource, not only for the parish but also for the local community.

Now almost 25 years later it is regularly used for meetings, private parties, exercise classes and fundraising events, as well as for Age UK's weekly drop-in coffee morning, a monthly lunch club and two weekly meetings for Weight Watchers.

The Link Room is a self-contained room situated within St Matthias Church, on Church Road in Malvern Link. Parking is available outside St Matthias, in Church Road itself and in the surrounding roads.



The room has a well fitted kitchen area with cooker, microwave, heated cabinet, fridge, hot water boiler and washing up facilities and is fully equipped with a range of crockery, cutlery and glassware, serving and cooking utensils, all are available for use by hirers.



The toilets are situated in the vestibule area between the main door into the church and the entrance to the Link Room, ladies, gents and one for the disabled, which also has nappy changing facilities.

The Link Room will comfortably seat at least 60 people when set around tables e.g. for a full meal and more if seating round tables is not required e.g. for a lecture.



There is a good supply of chairs and tables, some chairs are stored in the room and the remainder, along with the tables, in an area just off the room under the bell tower.



There are some tables which are lower in height and therefore suitable for use by younger children.
