If you are actively or passively working towards your advancement and/or the Ordinary Sea Scout rank, or just looking for fun as a scouting youth or adult.

# HERE IS WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT!

Two tacks will be executed during the regatta so prior knowledge and skills are not necessary to level the decks:

- $\Rightarrow$  *A Toe-in-the-water Tack* ... that allows land-lubbers to participate and compete against other land-lubbers.
- ⇒ *A Sea Scout Tack* ... that allows Ships to participate and compete against other Ships.
- ⇒ Separate Awards for Each Tack ... Includes a WCFC Engraved trophy for the Council office, and a "take home" trophy for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place units. Ribbon awards for individual events down to 6th place are also presented during Sundays awards lunch.
- ⇒ **In-the-boats & On-the-water** ... races with weather permitting two types of sailboats, including single-sail class (Sunfish), multi-sail class (Catalina 16 racing dinghies). Each event designed to introduce and provide practical experience on-the-water and in-the-boat. And then too, there is the cherished "Dink-Tug-O-War"!
- ⇒ *Sample Action-based Land Events* ... that are designed to gain practical experience toward the requirements for the Ordinary Sea Scout rank and beyond, such as these:
  - Dead Pan Lift— Block & Tackle Rigging
  - Head in the Clouds Weather
  - Ground Tackle Anchoring basics
  - Heave-Flick-Toss Line handling skills
  - Speak, See & Hear No Evil maritime communications
  - What Kind of Boat Vessel identification
  - Flag Your Ensign Flag Etiquette
  - Bend & Douse Points of sail skills and sail management
  - Jockey-Doc Vessel management docking skills
  - Rounding the Bitter End Knots, Hitches & Bends
- ⇒ **Bring Your Own Appetite** ... all meals from Saturday through Sunday noon will be prepared and provided to give you maximum time with the fun and friendship.
- ⇒ *An Evening that will have you "Chillin"* ... staff's choice potpourri extravaganza along with socializing and relaxation.
- ⇒ *Camping Overnight is New 2023 …* So bring you camping gear just in case but there are some vessel space still available!
