Smelting

Mined ores are processed to concentrate the minerals of interest. In the case of metal ores, these mineral concentrates usually need to be further processed to separate the metal from other elements in the ore minerals. Smelting is the process of separating the metal from impurities by heating the concentrate to a high temperature to cause the metal to melt. Smelting the concentrate produces a metal or a high-grade metallic mixture along with a solid waste product called slag.

Gold Smelting

Professional mining companies recover gold and other precious metals in quantities sufficient enough to pay refiners to do the smelting for them. But what can smaller scale recreational gold miners do? Consider melting or smelting your gold, silver, and other metals yourself! But first understand that there is a big difference between melting and smelting.

Melting means to change something from a solid to a liquid by the application of heat. When the heat is removed, the melted material returns to its solid state. Its chemical content has not been changed. Smelting, however, is a metallurgical term. It refers to "burning off" the impurities that your gold might be mixed with, resulting in nearly pure gold.

The British Goldpanning Association (BGA) and the communities of Moffat and district, Dumfries and Galloway, Scotland, are delighted to have been selected to host the 2017 World Championships. The responsibility for organising the championships has been delegated to a registered charity called Moffat Gold 2017 SCIO which is run by BGA members. The beautiful town of Moffat is located in the Southern Upland hills in southwest Scotland, and is a wonderful place for both individuals and families to visit and participate in the 2017 World Championships.

This is the first opportunity that Moffat has had to host the World Championships. However, some of you may remember that it was in 1992 the UK last hosted the World Goldpanning Championships. On that occasion they were held in the villages of Leadhills and Wanlockhead, which are approximately 20 miles to the west of Moffat, and to this day, they are fondly talked about in world gold panning circles. Wanlockhead is still host to the annual British Championships.






Have you Played the new Gold Rush Game?

RECIPES TO SHARE:

Gold Rush Drink:

Ingredients

Makes 1 Serving

- 2 ounces bourbon
- 3/4 ounce fresh lemon juice

3/4 ounce honey

Preparation

Combine bourbon, lemon juice, and honey in a cocktail shaker. Fill shaker with ice, cover, and shake very vigorously to help dissolve honey until outside of shaker is very cold, about 20 seconds.

Strain cocktail through a Hawthorne strainer or a slotted spoon into an old-fashioned or rocks glass with 1 large ice cube or several smaller ones. Honey can be slow to dissolve, so be sure to shake this one plenty.

Oscar Award Winning Popcorn:

Ingredients:

1 cup of yellow corn kernels

3 tablespoons of ghee

2 tablespoon of kosher salt

2 cups of your favorite candy

1/2 cup of mini pretzels

gold leaf flakes (optional)



In a large dutch oven or cast iron pot, melt the ghee over medium heat. After the ghee has melted, drop 3-4 kernels or corn inside the pot. Once the kernels pop open, the ghee is hot enough. Quickly dump the kernels and salt into the pot, give a quick stir and close the lid. Leave a tiny gap so that steam can escape from the pot. But keep that lid closed because kernels are going to be popping all over the place. After a few seconds you'll start hearing the popcorn go POP! POP! You might want to shake the pot back and forth a bit to prevent burning. Once the popping has slowed down, turn the heat off and wait until the last kernel has popped. Let the popcorn cool completely before mixing in your candy. I used mini Reece's peanut butter cups, mini Butterfinger, mini Kit Kat, Buncha Crunch and mini pretzels – YUM. But feel free to add your favorites! Give it all a toss and pour the mixture into paper lunch bags. And for that special Oscar-inspired touch, I've added edible gold leaf. Enjoy!
