Jackson North Medical Center Earns EPA's Energy Star® Certification For Superior Energy Efficiency

MIAMI – Jackson North Medical Center, a satellite of the Jackson Health System, has earned the 2012 U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) ENERGY STAR® certification, for energy efficiency. The Energy Star is awarded to buildings that perform in the top 25 percent of similar facilities nationwide for meeting strict energy efficiency performance levels. Jackson North is one of only three hospitals in Florida to achieve this designation and one of only 43 hospitals nationwide to earn the title of America's Energy All Star.

"Jackson North Medical Center is pleased to accept EPA's ENERGY STAR® certification in recognition of our energy efficiency efforts," said Michael Drenta, CHFM, director of Engi-

energy performance through managing energy strategically across the entire campus and by making cost-effective improvements. As a result, Jackson North prevented greenhouse gas emissions equal to 27.6 metric tons of carbon

neering Services at Jackson North Medical Center, "Through this achievement, this organization has demonstrated our commitment to environmental stewardship while also lowering our energy costs."

Achieving EPA's ENERGY STAR® certification at Jackson North Medical Center was a team effort. They met a strict EOS standard by using an average of 35 percent less energy than typical buildings and also releasing 35 percent less carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. This was accomplished by boosting its

dioxide equivalent into the environment.

Jackson North Medical Center's administration along with key entities took the following actions to optimize performance:

- Original windows were replaced with impact resistant windows resulting in less solar load and eliminating air infiltration.
- Exterior lighting was automated to adjust to variations in light levels.
- The ventilation of the facility was optimized following an audit that determined it was over ventilated.
- Installed a new building automation system (BacNet) to control major heating, ventilation and air conditioning equipment.
- Installed new chillers and cooling towers.

"Improving the energy efficiency of our nation's buildings is critical to protecting our environment," said Jean Lupinacci, Chief of the ENERGY STAR®

EPA's ENERGY STAR® energy performance scale helps organizations assess how efficiently their buildings use energy relative to similar buildings nationwide. A building that scores a 75 or higher on EPA's 1-100 scale may be eligible for ENERGY STAR® certification.

Jackson North Medical Center is a 382-bed, acute-care, community hospital serving the residents of North Miami-Dade County. It is also an academic affiliate of the Florida International University Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine. Jackson North's services include 24-hour adult and pediatric emergency care, cardiac care, maternity care, orthopedics, surgery, inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation, and wound care including hyperbaric chamber treatment/therapy. Jackson North is a joint commission certified advanced primary stroke center and a member of the Dade County STEMI Network for interventional cardiology.

Rich Armstrong Earns SASHE Designation

The FHEA was notified that one of its own, Richard C. Armstrong, Jr., CHE, CHFM, was awarded the distinct honor of Senior in ASHE (SASHE) designation by ASHE in June.

Recipients of this award must demonstrate outstanding leadership geared towards the goal of sharing their knowledge and expertise in a way that advances the healthcare engineering profession. In addition to requirements of job experience and academic credentials, they must hold leadership positions, and demonstrate proficiency in lecturing and writing within the field.

Rich, who serves this year as District III's president, is the Director of Facilities and Construction at St. Joseph's Hospitals - Baycare Health Systems.

When asked to comment on this achievement, he responded that he hoped that others would be encouraged to pursue ever higher goals in the healthcare engineering profession, in his words, to "Engage the Profession." His reward is "seeing others I have had some influence on succeed."

Our congratulations to Rich for setting an example for the rest of us to follow.

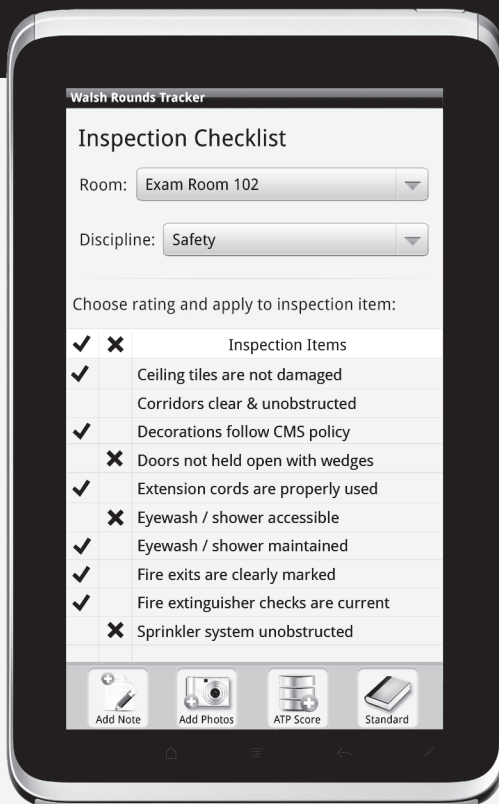
