Pink Out Night, Boots 'N Brews Saturday at Indiana Grand Racing & Casino

SHELBYVILLE, Ind. (Sept. 26, 2018) – Indiana Grand Racing & Casino will host its annual evening dedicated to cancer survivors Saturday, Sept. 29 with the third annual Pink Out Night. The event will be joined by Boots 'N Brews, which was postponed from earlier in the month due to inclement weather, creating a full night of activities at the track.

The Pink Out Walk will kick activities off with check-in beginning at 4 p.m. Zumba with Theresa will get participants warmed up for the walk at 4:25 p.m. with the walk beginning at approximately 4:40 p.m. The walk to honor all those affected by cancer will extend from the winner's circle into the barn area and back and is less than a one mile venture. Zumba will continue after the walk for those wishing to cool down.

The Morristown High School Music Makers Show Choir under the direction of Cindy Leahy will perform the National Anthem leading into racing at 6 p.m. The first race has been dedicated as the "Cancer Survivors Classic" with all individuals associated with cancer invited to come down to the winner's circle. Jockeys will wear pink helmet covers for the first race to show their support of the cause.

Peppermints for Ponies will be offered after races two and seven on the nine race program. Guests may purchase peppermints for 25 cents each or five for \$1.00 to feed to the pony horses, while supplies last. All proceeds will go to the Cancer Care Unit at Major Health Partners.

Along with Pink Out Night, the Indiana Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA) will feature Boots 'N Brews. Free live entertainment will begin at 6 p.m. by the Jai Baker Band along with a mechanical bull, rodeo roper, face painting, bounce house and a laptop giveaway after the sixth race on the program. Two local brews will also be featured including Riverfront Taproom's Working Man's Water and Two Hearted Ale. A specialty pink drink will also be featured throughout the evening.

The evening will be capped off with the 10th running of the \$122,600 Sterlie Bertram Memorial Stakes for three-year-old Quarter Horses. The race is slated as the ninth on the card with an estimated post time of 9:49 p.m. Rockys Candy Shop, ridden by Jose Beltran, will be seeking his third straight win from post seven for owner Lance Finlinson and trainer Randy Smith.

The 16th season of Thoroughbreds and Quarter Horse racing continues through Wednesday, Nov. 7. Racing is conducted Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 2:05 p.m. with Saturday racing beginning at 6:05 p.m.
