Dear Friends,

Presbyterian Women

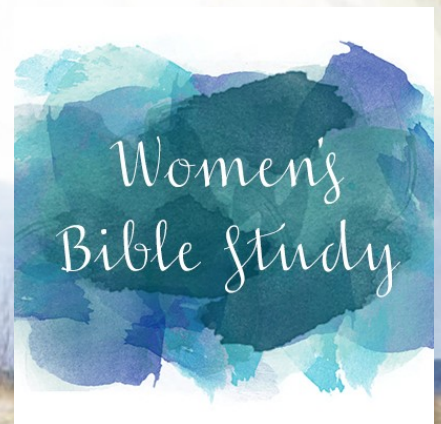

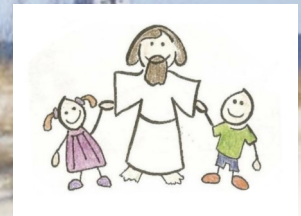

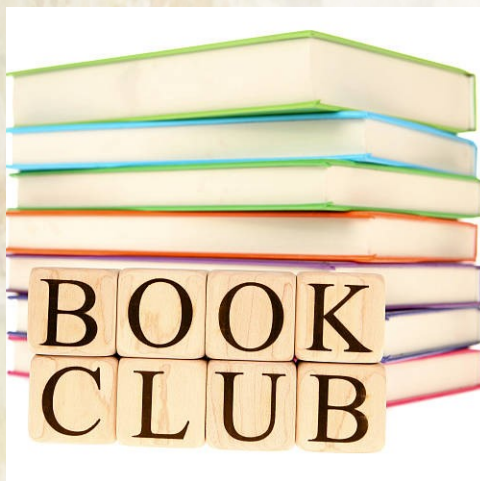


Children on Communion Sunday

Adult Sunday School

A Life of Martin Luther
by Roland H. Bainton

The Adult Bible Class will start the Martin Luther Series on September 24. We are using the book by Professor Roland H. Bainton, called *A Life of Martin Luther*. He was the Titus Street Professor of Ecclesiastical History at Yale Divinity School.

In the 16th Century, Martin Luther was a German monk whose protest against some of the doctrines of the Catholic Church led to the Protestant Reformation. Through Bainton's book, he brings to life Luther by carefully unfolding historical events which led up to the reformation and events that helped to shape Luther's thinking during and following the Reformation. The book begins with Luther's vow to become a monk during a thunderstorm in 1505, in order to save his soul, but he soon concluded more was needed. Luther felt the need to become perfect in order to obtain justification with God, and this quest defined Luther for the better part of his life.

Mr. Bainton was born in Ilkeston, Derbyshire, England and came to the United States in 1902.

This is the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's protest, so it is also a timely class to learn and reflect what the Reformation means to us. Join us at the Adult Bible Class on Sunday at 9:30am in the back building at the First Presbyterian Church. Call John Abeln @ 575-758-0613 for questions.

Loma Verde Camp

Loma Verde Camp needs to run a new electrical line from the Dining Hall to the Boys Dormitory to replace an old and not-to-code existing electrical line. This line will be about 350 feet. We need help for Friday Oct 6th thru Tuesday Oct 10th (this is the Columbus Day weekend).

The tasks include trenching, assisting the trencher by removing rocks and some shoveling, hand digging some line through tree roots, running electrical line through the trench and connecting line to the electrical boxes that will be underground. Camp Loma Verde is hiring someone to provide about half of the trenching labor, but we need able bodies to accomplish the trenching. We need to schedule 3 people every half day for the 5 days so that we don't physically damage any of our volunteers. This means we need a large volunteer force! Please help us!

Plans are to work 8:30-12:30 and 1:00-5:00

Sunday the schedule will be more like 11:00 - 1:30 and 2:00 - 5:00.

If you are concerned about a 4 hour shift, Sunday might be a good option.

Snacks and lunch will be provided!

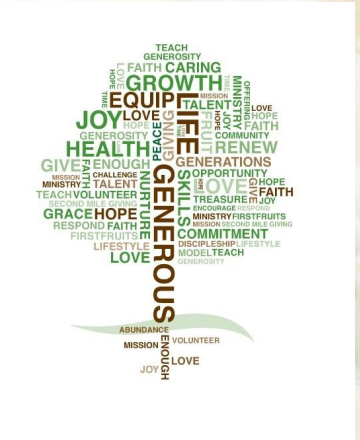

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY
October 1st, 2017

The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. World Communion Sunday is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933, where Rev. Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor.

Kerr first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). It began as an attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another.

Rev. Dr. Kerr described how the idea of World Communion Sunday spread from that first service to the worldwide practice of today:

“The concept spread very slowly at the start. People did not give it a whole lot of thought. It was during the Second World War that the spirit caught hold, because we were trying to hold the world together. World Wide Communion symbolized the effort to hold things together, in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ.”

Celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating how, in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed, the church founded on Jesus Christ continues to peacefully share in the abundance of God-given goods.

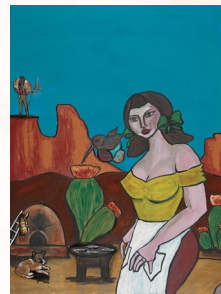
