Angel M. Vázquez-Ramos, a native of Carolina, Puerto Rico is Assistant Professor and Director of Choral & Vocal Studies at California State University, Bakersfield. He teaches undergraduate courses in music education, choral conducting, and conducts the University Singers and Chamber Singers. Before his appointment to CSUB, he served as Director of Choral Music Education at Chapman University from 2010 to 2015. Before completing his doctoral studies at Florida State University, Dr. Vázquez-Ramos taught secondary choral music for seven years in Pinellas County Schools in the Tampa Bay Area. He previously held positions in churches in both Largo and Tallahassee, Florida, and San Clemente, California. His research interests include: teacher preparation, rehearsal techniques, adolescent choirs, and assessment in music education. He is currently serving on the CCDA Board as the College and University

Repertoire & Standards chair and previously served on the board as Youth and Student Activities chair. Dr. Vázquez-Ramos is a member of the American Choral Directors Association and NAfME: National Association for Music Education. He completed his Bachelors of Music Education degree at the University of Puerto Rico. In addition, he received a Masters in Music Education and Ph.D. in Music Education/Choral Conducting at Florida State University where he studied with André J. Thomas, Rodney Eichenberger, Judy K. Bowers, and Kevin A. Fenton. He has published articles on assessment in music education teacher the Journal and preparation in of Research Music Education, the International Journal of Research in Choral Singing and the Florida Music Director.

Dr. Collinsworth received his Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education and Master of Music degree in saxophone performance from the University of Nevada at Reno. He received his Doctor of the Musical Arts degree in Conducting from Arizona State University. Prior to joining the Sonoma State faculty in 2008, Dr. Collinsworth taught for nearly twenty years in California public schools. From 1996 to 2005 he was Director of Instrumental Music at Maria Carrillo High School in Santa Rosa, California, where ensembles under his direction were recognized for their superior performances. Dr. Collinsworth maintains an active schedule as a guest conductor, adjudicator and clinician throughout California and the Western states. His critical edition

MACCC is pleased to announce our strings master class clinician - Mads Tolling!! I have performed with Mads and he is not just a great player but a great person as well. Here is a portion of his bio- and you can see the rest at his website. He is the real deal!

Mads Tolling, internationally renowned violinist and composer, is a two-time Grammy Award-Winner and the 2016 DownBeat Critics Poll Rising Star winning violinist. As a former nine-year member of both Turtle Island Quartet and bassist Stanley Clarke's band, Mads has spent most his professional life touring internationally. Since 2007 Mads has lead his own group, Mads Tolling Quartet.

"The Playmaker" released in the fall of 2009, features Stanley Clarke and jazz greats Russell Ferrante & Stefon Harris. A MTQ album: "Celebrating Jean-Luc Ponty – Live at Yoshi's" was released in May, 2012. Mads' latest album is called "Mads Tolling & The Mads Men – Playing the 60s," which features classic songs from TV, film and radio in fresh jazzy versions with guest vocalists Kenny Washington and Spencer Day. Mads has been featured on NPR's Morning Edition, and his recordings have received rave reviews in Downbeat Magazine, Strings Magazine, Washington Post and the San Francisco Chronicle. He has performed with Chick Corea, Ramsey Lewis, Kenny Barron & Paquito D'Rivera.

MACCC PIANO MASTER CLASS Omri Shimron, CSU East Bay

Our Northern California instrumental representative, after procuring Mads, has also booked the piano professor from CSU East Bay (formerly CSU Hayward) to teach our Piano Master class! A brief bit from his Bio - and his web site:

Omri Shimron is a pianist, educator, and recording artist. He was born in the United States but raised in Israel, where he received his early musical training. His debut album, featuring Frederic Rzewski's 36 Variations on 'The People United Will Never Be Defeated!' was released in July 2014 on New Focus Records. Since 2013, he has been on faculty at the Rebecca Penneys Piano Festival at the University of South Florida, Tampa. As a pianist, he appeared at the Jerusalem Music Center, the Jerusalem Academy of Music and the Tel Aviv Museum. In the United States, he won prizes from the Josef



Hoffman Piano Competition and the Chautauqua Institution. As an orchestral soloist, Shimron played with the Hillsdale College/Community Orchestra, the Finger Lakes Symphony, and the Elon University Orchestra. Collaborative and solo concerts have included appearances at the Kennedy Center's Millennium Stage and New York City's Sundays on the Island series. Live radio performances featured sessions for WBFO, WXXI, and WUSF stations.

Ken Eberhard is a two-time Emmy winning composer who writes music for television and film. He has been working as a composer, orchestrator, and director of production at Ah2 Music since 2006. His music has been heard on numerous television productions such as *Shark Tank, Hotel Hell, Cutthroat Kitchen, Best New Restaurant, The Profit, Restaurant Startup, Police Women, The Quest, Deal With It, Monsters Inside Me,* and *Married by Mom and Dad*. He has orchestrated for composers Mark T.
