



EVIDENCE. Part of the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples in bodily form. What exactly this form was, we're not sure. When Magdalen first encountered the risen Jesus, she didn't recognize him—



—thought he was the gardener. In Luke, disciples on the road to Emmaus also failed to recognize Jesus until he broke bread with them.

As in today's Gospel, Jesus' resurrected body was no longer bound by space. He entered the room through locked doors. Still, on his resurrected flesh, the disciples could still see the marks of his Crucifixion.

The Resurrection is more than just a spiritual reality. Jesus offers physical evidence. Our Lord understands that it is part of human nature to seek hard evidence. He wants them to know that the same Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death is the same Jesus who was crucified.

Jesus breathed on the disciples, and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

It's a different kind of 'evidence', but 18 young people, 9 from St Mark's and 9 from St Andrew's, experienced this last night. From the hands of Bishop Folda, they received the Holy Spirit. We congratulate these young people. They are evidence

to us that the story continues to unfold. The Risen Christ continues to emerge into a fresh generation of believers.

They have much more to learn and experience in their walk with Christ. But it won't be long, and we'll be sending them into the world to walk through the locked doors of fear, violence, drugs, uncertainty, unbelief, and much more. How important it is to be *strong* in one's faith, which is what *confirmed* refers to.

Jesus in the Gospel says, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." We don't get to see Jesus in the flesh the way the Apostles did. But we do get to see faith in action. We do get to see young people eager to receive Jesus for the first time in Holy Communion, and hopefully for a lifetime afterwards.

If we are the Body of Christ, and we are, it is a special grace for us to see beyond young people experiencing something new, and really believe that in them we behold the Risen Christ reaching out, shepherding humanity, and forming the Kingdom of God.

Thanks to all the families and religious education teams that have prepared these youth for this great step forward. In them we see some of the hard evidence we seek in understanding that the Risen One walks with us. In our ancestors, he paved the way. In our youth, he has our back.
