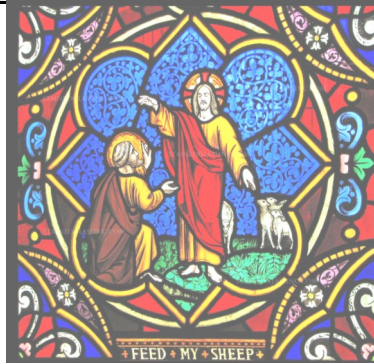


MODELING HEALING. Actions, not just words, are important to restoring hurt relationships.

Reading a bit between the lines, Jesus waits a while before dealing with Peter. John writes, "This was the third time Jesus appeared to his core group." The first two times nothing was said to Peter. Only after this third time does Jesus confront him. 'Confront' is too strong of a term. Jesus does it gently, but still, there a beautiful gravity behind the simple exchange.

Let's appreciate Jesus' style. For one, He waits. He's already forgiven Peter, but he knows Peter's denials hurt their relationship. There's need for healing. Healing is a two-sided thing, usually.

Think about when you've experienced a hurting relationship. Even after asking for and receiving forgiveness, there is often a period of time when we are more careful about what we say and how we act around the person we have hurt. Even if we have heard words of forgiveness, it takes time for that forgiveness to feel real.



Two, Jesus is indirect in his method. Remember, Peter, the Rock, the leader and mouthpiece, out 'n out denied Jesus the day (or night before) the Lord was executed. Jesus doesn't go there. Rather, he asks a question. How many times does Jesus ask? The triple question, "Do you love me?" clearly reflects the triple negation. Peter knows what's going on.

Three, Jesus reassures Peter that their relationship is on good terms. How? He entrusts Peter with responsibility. By telling Peter, "Tend my sheep / Feed my sheep," Jesus is handing leadership over to Peter. This trust restores their relationship.

At Easter, we renewed our baptismal promises. We professed our Faith and were sprinkled with Holy Water. In Baptism, the Lord entrusted us, usually through our parents and godparents, with a mission to love and serve others in Jesus' name. Like Peter, we sin and turn away

from Jesus. The mission Jesus gives us can slow down or grind to a halt. Part of our Easter celebration, following (for many) a fruitful celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, is a joyful re-commitment to our mission.



Our relationship with Jesus is healed and restored. Easter joy is getting back again into the game of being Jesus' devoted disciples of Jesus. He sends us into this world revived and ready to shoulder our share of loving, serving, tending and feeding others.
