ALWAYS LEARNING. Pope Francis' document on the family develops doctrine, but doesn't change it. *Amoris laetitia*, The Joy of Love, has true innovations, but no break in tradition. It emphasizes the need for greater discernment by pastors and Catholic couples in so-called "irregular" situations as they look for ways they can participate more deeply in the life of the Church.

This is nothing new. We've always had the duty to be thoughtful and not play around with the Sacraments or with conscience.

Those in a broken marriage must honestly examine their conscience before God. Was it valid in the first place? They need to honestly, prayerfully ask that question. "We have been called to form consciences not replace them," Francis wrote.

Looking at the situation of marriage the world over, the Pope denounced the excesses of male chauvinism and says "we must see in the women's movement the working of the Spirit for a clearer recognition of the dignity and rights of women."

Chapter 8 is the most controversial section of the document. In it, the Holy Father states,

"It can no longer be said that all those in any irregular union are living in a state of mortal sin and are deprived of sanctifying grace." What this implies is currently the source of much debate. He recognizes that "No easy recipes exist and as a result neither the Synod nor this exhortation could be expected to provide a new set of general rules to be applicable in all cases."

He calls for divorced and civilly remarried Catholics to be more fully integrated into the Christian Community. In a footnote, he encourages

them to use the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and how they should expect tenderness from the Church's ministers. And about the Eucharist, he writes, "it is not a prize for the perfect, but powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak." Is this opening the door to offering Holy Com-

munion to those who are divorced and remarried? Seems to be, but not a blanket permission. The Pope is simply acknowledging what is already happening all over the world. Not all situations are the same. Pastors and couples must discern.

This "discernment"—weighing as best we can how God sees things—is how the Holy Spirit continues to lead the Church and *teach us everything*—just as Jesus promised in our Gospel today.




GOD'S GIFT APPEAL 2016— LET THE CHURCH ALWAYS BE A PLACE OF MERCY!

PENTECOST NOVENA BEGINS this coming Friday. A novena is made up of nine days of prayers for a special cause. The Novena in honor of the Holy Spirit is the most ancient of all novenas. It began with the Apostles, when Jesus sent them to Jerusalem to await his final Gift from On High. This is the origin of the word and practice of the *novena*, from the Latin for *ninth day*. This wonderful Novena of the Holy Spirit is a powerful way for individuals or families to prepare to receive the light, strength and courage we need to live friendship with Christ.
