**AN EYE FOR THE HEART.**

Shepherd, musician, song writer, soldier, king, adulterer, and murderer – such was David, the only man in the Bible of whom God says, “a man after my own heart” (Ac 13:22).


As we'll hear from St. Paul in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading, David did not earn his distinction by “works of the law.” Our 1<sup>st</sup> Reading makes abundantly clear that David is a great sinner. He uses ‘the sword of the Ammonites’ to do his dirty work, trying to cover up his adultery with Bathsheba, wife of Uriah.

Despite his whopper of a sin, David had reverence on his side. He fell, but he also knew that he walked in the light of God. When Samuel anointed him king, God told the prophet that He does not judge by appearances, but rather “looks into the heart” (1 Sm 16:7).

Although a wayward child, David did not forget that God remained his Father. Confronted with his sin, he did not despair. His heart was repentant. He realized that he'd betrayed the Lord and he accepted the consequences of his sins.

This is what cares about most, the heart.

In our Catholic tradition, we speak of mortal and venial sins, see *Catechism of the Cath Ch*, par. 1854-64. Mortal sin destroys charity in the heart and turns radically away from God. David's sins certainly appear to be of a



mortal nature. Such serious sins demand a fresh start and a conversion of heart. This is usually done most easily, nowadays, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

No one ever went to Hell for committing a mortal sin. It is only when we refuse to repent of sin, it is only when we willfully effuse to bounce back that we put our hearts in dire jeopardy.

David shows us the heart of one who bounces back. If anyone


knows our hearts, it is God. The Lord is less impressed with one who shakes in His face a list of good deeds (self-righteousness) than with one who is humble and contrite of heart, whose righteousness is sheer gift and not of one's own making.

The story of David is showcased in the Bible and should also find a prominent place in our hearts.

**THE SACRED HEART.** The Church dedicates the month of June to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Understood in the light of Scripture, the term “Sacred Heart of Jesus” refers to the entire mystery of Christ, the totality of his being, and the infinite divine-human love Jesus has for the Father and for all people, his sisters and brothers.


Jesus, who is one with the Father (cf. John 10:30), invites his disciples to model their lives on him. He sows them that he is “meek and humble of heart” (Mt 11:29). Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a gaze upon him whose side was pierced with a lance (cf. John 19:37), and from



which flowed blood and water, symbols of the “wondrous sacrament of the Church” (St. Augustine) – the blood signifying the Eucharist, the water signifying Baptism.

John the Evangelist tells how the Lord showed his disciples his hands and his side (Jn 20:20). He even invited Thomas to put his hand into his side (Jn 20:27). This event is the ultimate origin of the Church's devotion to the Sacred Heart.

Throughout the centuries, the Church has approved many prayers and litanies expressing this special devotion. Look up *Sacred Heart of Jesus*, and try one!
