




HANDING ON FAITH THROUGH LOVE.

Children, once born, begin to receive, along with nourishment and care the spiritual gift of knowing with certainty that they are loved.


Every child has a right to receive love from a mother and a father, both are necessary for a child's integral and harmonious development.

We often hear that ours is 'a society without fathers.' In Western culture, the father figure is said to be symbolically absent, missing, or vanished. Manhood itself seems called into question. The result has been an understandable confusion.



And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers...

God sets the father in the family so that by the gifts of his masculinity he can be close to his wife and share everything, joy and sorrow, hope and hardship. And to be close to his children as they grow—when they play and when they work, when they are carefree and when they are distressed, when they are talkative and when they are silent, when they are daring and when they are afraid, when they stray and when they get back on the right path.



In Luke, Jesus asks: "But who do you say that I am?" We, even we, who are apostles and servants of the Lord need to respond because the Lord asks us: "What do you think of me?" ...With Jesus, we cannot speak of him as an historic figure, a figure of history. **Jesus is living in front of us. This question is asked by a living person. And we have to respond from the heart.** ...And when we say, from veneration and from love, secure, secure on the rock of his love and guidance: "You are the anointed one", this will do us much good and it will make us move forward with certainty and pick up the cross daily, which is heavy at times. Let us go forward like this, with joy, and asking for this grace: grant to your people, Father, to always live in veneration and love for your Holy Name!

To be a father is to be always present. When I say 'present,' I do not mean 'controlling.' Fathers who are controlling overshadow their children, they do not let them develop.

A father helps the child perceive the limits of life, to be open to challenges of the wider world, and to see the need for hard work and strenuous effort. A father possessed of clear and serene masculine identity who demonstrates affection and concern for his wife is just as necessary as a caring mother.

There can be certain flexibility of roles and responsibilities, depending on the concrete circumstances of each particular family. But the clear and well-defined presence of both figures, female and male, creates the environment best suited to the growth of the child.
