

Here are some passages.


"Parents rely on schools... but can never

completely delegate the moral formation of their children to others. person's affective and ethical development is ultimately grounded in a particular experience, namely, that his or her parents can be trusted."

"Parents always influence the moral development of their children, for better or for worse. Parents need to consider what they want their children to be exposed to who is providing their entertainment, who is entering their rooms through television and electronic devises."

"Vigilance is always necessary and neglect is never beneficial. Obsession, however, is not education. What is most important is lovingly to help their children grow in freedom. The real question is where our children are in terms of their convictions, goals, desires and

dreams. Do we seek to understand 'where' our children really are on their journey?"



"The better we live on this earth, the greater the happiness we will be able to share with our loved ones in Heaven. The more we able to mature and develop in this world, the more gifts will we be able to bring to the heavenly banquet."

I echo Pope Francis' words encouraging parents in the active role they take in forming their children. Our parishes are here to help. Religious education is first


