


'LONG-VIEW' ECONOMICS. Sometimes, Jesus was dismayed that non-believers had more determination than believers. To inspire a sense of initiative, he tells them a parable.

A master dismisses his steward because he is squandering property. He's dishonest in not serving the interests of his employer. In response the steward, to win favor among his master's debtors, brokers some deals. It is unclear if the steward is deducting his own commission or his boss's profit, but what is clear is that he is taking the long view to enhance his security. For this, the rich man commends him.

The passage contains a few morals. First, be prudent about the use of wealth and get a perspective. Like the steward in the parable, those who follow Jesus should handle temporal affairs with an eye to eternal life, that is, the long view.

Second, those who can be trusted in small things can also be trusted in great things. To handle money and other passing things responsibly, prepares one for the business of the Kingdom of God. Our impact on the Kingdom of God is influenced by how we behave with worldly goods.



Finally, no one can serve two masters simultaneously. We must put God ahead of money. When money is used with a view to Heaven, there's no risk of it overthrowing God as the center of our life and the goal of our destiny.

The Lord wants to see his disciples be as pro-active as possible with their resources, aiming for eternal life.

Our parishes are places where people can share their wealth with an aim to Heaven. Upkeep of the parish community, where the Gospel is heard and the Sacraments are celebrated, is just one way this happens.
