# From the Pastor's Pen

A FAMILY AFFAIR. Jesus tells his disciples he's going to prepare a place for them in his Father's house. He promises: where I'm going you will follow. Thomas, the doubter, contradicts Jesus. He says the disciples don't know where Jesus is going or how to get there. Jesus explains, I am the way, the truth, and the life. In knowing and loving Jesus, the disciples know and love the Father.

Next, Philip challenges Jesus' words. Philip wants Jesus to show them the Father. Like a good teacher, Jesus repeats and elaborates on what he has just told them: to know him, Jesus, is to know the Father. Then Jesus reassures them that they'll continue his work and then some.

We often experience that the more time we spend with someone, the more like that person we become. We observe this with friends and among family members. In my family, we call

our youngest sister "little CJ", because she can be so like Mom (Carol Jean). I've noticed for years now that when my brother hangs up the phone, his voice and words are a perfect echo of Dad's.

While we each remain unique individuals, so many of our habits, expressions, our accent, even our fears and prejudices, or our hobbies and passions rub off on us from others.

Jesus wants his disciples to understand the union he has with his Father. With that, he also wants his disciples to understand that their union with him—by believing in him—is bound to rub off in remarkable ways. He even goes so far as to promise that through this faith they'll be able to do the work that he did and "greater works than these!"

We can struggle to understand how tight we're supposed to be as Christians, as brothers and sisters in the same household of Faith. Interesting how Christ's first disciples also struggled to understand the depth of union Jesus envisioned. Then as now, this family of Faith is none other than an extension across the ages of the Son's oneness with his Father.

This is the Family purchased by the Lord's death and resurrection. Ohh, how he wants to do great things through us.

**100<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF THE APPARITIONS OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA.** Talk about parents' traits rubbing off on their children, I definitely inherited a devotion to O.L. of Fatima from my Mom. It was the Cold War. She used to devour stories of people who had escaped from behind the Iron Curtain.



These stories were tied to hopes and prayers that 'Russia' would be converted,' according to the promise of Mary to the three shepherd children of Fatima. Even today, Mom and I can get into long conversations about world affairs, and it all seemed to start with the message of Fatima.

In case you're not familiar with the story, here is a summary.


Mary appeared to 3 simple shepherd children 6 times in 1917. She asked them to warn the world of upcoming trials and tribulations. The three children were: Jacinta. 7. and Francisco, 9 (brother and sister), and their cousin Lucia, 10.

It happened in Fatima, Portugal. Centuries before the apparitions, from 711-1492 A.D., Muslims conquered and occupied the lands of Spain and Portugal. During this time of Moorish occupation, this small village in Portugal was named after a beloved 12<sup>th</sup> century Muslim princess named Fatima. Due to the reconquest by the defending Christian forces, the Islamic Princess Fatima was captured. She married a Spanish Count and converted to Catholicism. She, like many in the Is-

lamic faith, was named after the daughter of Mohammed, the founder of Islam who lived from 570 to 632 A.D. When his daughter Fatima died, Mohammed expressed in his grief, "She has the highest place in heaven after the Virgin Mary."



After three appearances of an Angel to the children over the course of a year, on May 13, 1917, the 3 youth took their flocks out to pasture when two bright flashes like lightning from out of the clear blue sky startled them. Lucia describes what they saw above a shrub, "A lady, clothed in white, brighter than the sun, radiating a light more clear and intense than a crystal cup filled with sparkling water, lit by burning sunlight."

The Lady smiled and said, "Do not be afraid, I will not harm vou."

Lucia asked where she was from and what she wanted.

The Lady pointed to the sky saying, "I come from heaven. I have come to ask you to come here for six months on the 13th day of the month, at this same hour. Later I shall say who I am and what I desire. And I shall return here yet a seventh time."

Lucia asked if they would go to heaven. The Lady told her that she and Jacinta would go to heaven, but Francisco would need to say many rosaries first. Then she said, "Are you willing to offer vourselves to God and bear all the sufferings He wills to

send you, as an act of reparation for the conversion of sinners?" Lucia, with the approval of the other two children, agreed, and the Lady continued, "Then you are going to have much to suffer, but the grace of God will be your comfort." As she said this, the Lady opened her hands. A stream of light fell on the children allowing them to see themselves in God. The Lady finished, "Say the rosary every day, to bring peace to the world and the end of the war." The Lady then rose up into the air, moving east, until she disappeared.
