

From the Pastor's Pen &



WALKING WITH THE RISEN JESUS. "Why are you frightened? Why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet. It's me. Touch me and see. Does a ghost have flesh and bones as you see I have?" When he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. Bewildered by an incredible joy they were still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" (Luke 24:39-41)

Let me get back to this passage from today's Gospel.

Sun-Tues, I joined fellow priests from the Dioc of Fargo in Carrington for some continuing education. We heard from several qualified speakers about the situation of rural life today.

Dr. Greg Lardy, Vice Pres of Agricultural Affairs, NDSU, spoke to us about 6 trends driving change in agriculture. We were sensitized to many of the fears and uncertainties that weigh on the lives of farm families, like the rise of production costs, health care, the high costs for young farmers to enter the business, the constant shift towards consolidation of land, resources, etc., and the unrelenting push towards high tech.

Jesus asks, "Why are you frightened?" Well, we heard plenty of reasons.

We also learned that experts are estimating a world population in 2050 of 9-9 ½ billion, with several mega-cities in Asia & Africa counting 100,000,000 people each. Producing and distributing food to these people will be a huge global challenge. The American Midwest will have a vital role to play.

Jesus asks, "Have you anything to eat?" A question the world already poses, and it's only getting louder.

A simple observation, the Risen Jesus appears to his disciples. To take away their fears, he asks for some food. This proves he's not a ghost, but a living human being. It's not so far-fetched to say, Jesus wants to take away the fears of rural America by asking for something to eat.

The Risen Lord wanted to walk with his disciples and he wants to walk with us. He wanted to be seen and touched then. How do we do that now?

Let me introduce 2 more speakers.

Fr. Gregory Mastey, pastor of a 4-parish cluster in the Dioc of St. Cloud, MN, grew up on a diversified livestock farm with his parents and 6 siblings. He was very active in FFA, 4-H, band, and life on the family farm. While studying for the priesthood, he also got a degree in taxidermy. Ordained in 1995, he enjoys hunting, fishing, fourwheeling, gardening, and spending time with others. He loves helping people fall more deeply in love with God and our Blessed Mother through ordinary rural living.



Jim Ennis is Executive Director of Catholic Rural Life (CRL), a non-profit organization serving the rural Church in the U.S. for 94+ years. CRL develops rural leaders through education, advocacy and outreach programs. Jim also serves as President of the International Catholic Rural Association (ICRA) based in Rome. He teaches at the Univ of St. Thomas in St Paul, Minn, and speaks around the world on issues related to the Vocation of the Agricultural Leader. A native of California, Jim is married with five children and now lives in St. Paul. MN.

These two men offered a boatload of ideas. How can Church-life and life in an agricultural community support one another?

Celebrating the Feast of St. Isidore which is on May 15.

Rogation Days (litanies and the blessing of seeds/fields/crops/harvest etc.)

Claiming other spaces besides the parish as sacred, for ex., Masses out at folks'

Life in Christ retreats for forming Agricultural Leaders.

Blessing/distributing Crosses for farms/gardens.

Blessing/distributing Holy Water in bottles for people to bless their fields/gardens.

Blessing snowmobiles/motorcycles/boats.

Planting trees/shrubs at the cemetery.

Such are just a few ways in which the Church can host a meeting between the Risen Lord Jesus and the prairie people he cherishes. Please feel free to help me make this happen.
