

# From the Pastor's Pen &



**GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY.** The 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter always carries a Gospel from St. John's 'Good Shepherd Discourse' (chap 10). Today, we hear Jesus say, "I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead. They will hear my voice and there will be one flock, one shepherd" (Jn 10:16). One way this movement unfolds across History is through what we call 'religious vocations'.

#### World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

The World Day of Prayer for Vocations fulfills the Lord's deep wish, 'Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38). The Church continuously offers this prayer. It affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), to the Religious life in all its forms (male and female, contemplative and apostolic), to societies of apostolic and missionary life.

"The Lord's call is not as clear-cut as those things we can hear, see or touch in our daily experience. God comes silently and discreetly, without imposing on our freedom. Thus it can happen that his voice is drowned out by the many worries and concerns that fill our minds and hearts. We need, then, to learn how to listen carefully to his word and the story of his life, but also to be attentive to the details of our own daily lives, in order to learn how to view things with the eyes of faith, and to keep ourselves open to the surprises of the Spirit." Pope Francis' message for World Day of Prayer for Vocations,

St. Mark's Feast – besides our Feast, to which all are warmly invited after the Sun morning Mass (Apr 22), we will honor the Feast day of Saint Mark (April 25) by administering the Sacrament of the Anointing at our Eucharistic celebrations. "He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two.... They anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them" (Gospel of

St Mk 6:7-13).

Ministry of Healing. In the First Reading, we hear St. Peter declare, "...in his name this man stands before you healed" (Ac 4:10). In 1975, as the Church went about

revising the Sacraments following the Second Vatican Council, Blessed Paul VI said the Anointing was "to lead to a wider availability of the Sacrament and to extend it—within reasonable limits—even beyond cases

of mortal illness.

We read in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Illness and suffering have always been among the gravest problems confronted in human life. In illness, man experiences his powerlessness, his limitations, and his finitude. Every illness can make us glimpse death. Illness can lead to anguish, self-absorption, sometimes even despair and revolt against God. It can also make a person more mature, helping him discern in his life what is not essential so that he can turn toward that which is. Very often illness provokes a search for God and a return to him.

The man of the Old Testament lives his sickness in the presence of God. It is before God that he laments his illness, and it is of God, Master of life and death, that he implores healing. Illness becomes a way to conversion; God's forgiveness initiates the healing (CCC 1500-1502).

Our mission as Church is to do what Jesus did. The pages of the Gospel are full of Jesus' concern for the sick. Healing was essential to the mission of the disciples: Since Jesus' ascension into Heaven, the Church continues this ministry through the great and simple Sacrament of healing.

The administration of this Sacrament at Masses this weekend to those who are conscious of being endangered by some form of illness or advanced age is the first step in a larger plan to consider how our parishes are called to be places of healing. what that might look like, and who it would involve.

Pope Francis' hard-hitting 100-page Apostolic Exhortation Gaudete et Exsultate (Rejoice and Be Glad) sheds light on how people can be holy in a modern world filled with secular distractions and materialism. For the next few weeks, we'll run a few quotes. "Not infrequently, contrary to the promptings of the Spirit, the life of the Church can become a museum piece or the possession of a select few. This can occur when some groups of Christians give excessive importance to certain rules, customs or ways of acting."
