



From the Pastor's Pen



THE HINGE. Saint Luke wrote a 2-part work. Part 1, the Gospel of Luke; Part 2, the Acts of the Apostles. We hear the opening lines of Part 2 as our 1st Reading on this Feast of the Ascension. The Ascension of Jesus is the Hinge Mystery—where the Gospels end and where the life of the Church begins.

Luke, we find, is writing to Theophilus (Lk 1:3; Ac 1:1). This could and should be each of us. Theophilus is Greek for "Lover of God."



As Jesus is "taken up into heaven," the spreading of the Faith passes to the Apostles. With the invisible help of his grace, "the Lord worked with them and confirmed the message."

This mission was simple enough to understand but difficult to carry out. To teach others all Jesus had taught them requires one thing above all else, the Love of God, to be a *Theophilus*.

Just as Jesus' disciples had followed him, they'd go out and ask others to accept and follow him too. The work of conversion and salvation must unfold from generation to generation. With all the changes in our Church and our society, two things have not changed: The *Message* and the *Messenger*. People who worry about changes in Church and society can always re-find their footing by returning to the basics.

The Message is God's Love.

The Messengers are the lovers of God.

Though unseen, Jesus is with us still. "I am with you always" (Mt 28:20).

When we're alone there's no need to feel lonely. By Christ's grace and in the right frame of mind we can admit: *never less alone than when alone* ("minus solum, quam cum solus" Cicero, or St. Bernard of Clairvaux). Communication with our Lord needs but one thing, Love—the great Door that swings both ways between Heaven and Earth.

Another Name for this Love, the Holy Spirit.

Come, Holy Spirit,, fill the hearts of Your faithful, and enkindle in them the fire of Your love.

V. Send forth Your Spirit, and they shall be created,

R. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

Let us pray.

O God, Who instructed the hearts of Your faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant us by the same Spirit to be truly wise and ever to rejoice in His consolation, through Christ our Lord. Amen.
