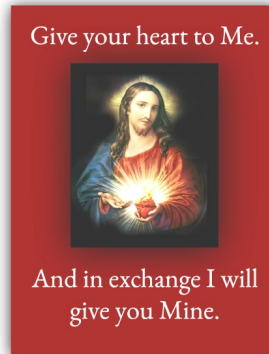

From the Pastor's Pen



CORPUS CHRISTI. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of our Lord. Jesus invites us to participate in a meal where he himself is the Food and Drink, prepared in the kitchen of Calvary. Jesus' own words at the Last Supper tied the bread and wine to the offering of his very self on the Cross. By this gift of the Eucharist, Jesus gives his *remembering* disciples the most perfect gift of Love.

The Eucharist is a communal, sacrificial meal. The Mass, by itself, does not make a community. It presumes a community. At Mass, the Father nourishes that community. Community means healing and reconciliation. It means communion. It means love. Jesus showed this at the Last Supper by washing the feet of the disciples.

There once was a young woman who wanted to teach her friend about the mystery of love. The two had grown very close. One day they were sitting together on a dock. She filled the palms of her hand with water. Holding the little pool towards him, she said: "This water symbolizes love." She nodded and raised her hands.

He understood and cupped his hands below hers. She let the water drain from her hands into his.

"As long as you keep your hands open, love remains," she continued. "But try to close your fingers 'round it, what happens?"

"Spills all over. You lose it," he replied.

"This is the greatest mistake people make when they meet love. Try to possess it and you lose it. Love, to be love, has to be free."

Maybe the Eucharist is like a pool of love? God knows we'll spill, so he keeps pouring this love into our open hands. When one stops to think about the free outpouring of love through each day's tens of thousands of Masses over the face of the Earth, we can't help but pause and marvel at what it means to carry this gift.

Pope Benedict once made a connection between love received at Mass and adoration of the Eucharist:

"In the Eucharist, the Son of God comes to meet us and desires to become one with us. Eucharistic adoration is simply the natural consequence of the Eucharistic celebration. Receiving the Eucharist means adoring him whom we receive. Only in this way do we become one with him."

"The act of adoration outside Mass prolongs and intensifies all that takes place during the liturgical celebration itself. This personal encounter with the Lord strengthens the social mission contained in the Eucharist, which seeks to break down not only the walls that separate the Lord and ourselves, but also and especially the walls that separate us from one another" (Pope Benedict, *The Sacrament of Charity* paragraph 67).

Thank you, dear flock of Christ, for finding in the Eucharist the great glue that holds us together in the Body of Christ.

We humbly beg of You to bless and sanctify the eggs of these clean birds so that those who partake of them may be filled with Your abundant blessing and merit to be brought to the pastures of eternal life through Christ our Lord. **R. Amen.** (*And they are sprinkled with holy water.*)

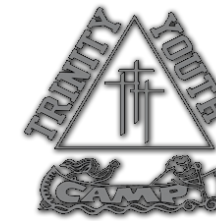

Get outside and get to know yourself & other people your age, God, and what you believe.

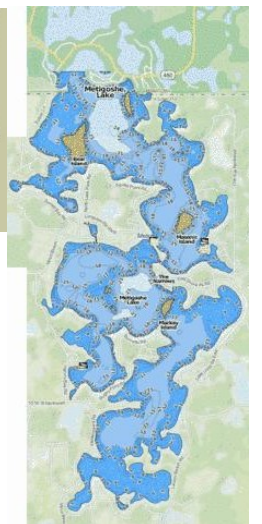
