From the Pastor's Pen

WISDOM BUILT HERSELF A HOUSE (PROVERBS 9:1). It's summertime. Among other things, it's construction time. In the Gospel Jesus uses a parable about a house. "A house divided against itself cannot stand" (Mk 3:25). IT IS IMPORTANT THAT LEADERS LISTEN TO WHAT

This is not a building but a movement. Initially, he is putting to rest concerns that "he has gone out of his mind" (Mk 3:21). What's the trouble?

Jesus had gone away. Stories start circulating. He's healing, forgiving people's sins, challenging Sabbath customs. Then he comes home. His family wants to whisk him away from the public eye—and talk some sense into him. Somebody has called on the authorities; they've arrived from Jerusalem. Their verdict is swift, 'He's got the devil in him.'

How typical this is, unfortunately. The Devil is certainly alive and active. There are evil deeds and those forces luring us away from the good path never seem to let up. But how often is our labelling of 'evil' or 'demonic' a partisan accusation?

In our 1st Reading, we hear, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel" (Gn 3:15). The Lord is addressing the Serpent. We need the constant reminder that "our struggle is not against flesh and blood but Principalities and Powers, the dark forces of this world…" (Eph 6:12). Thank you, St. Paul! He is saying these dark forces in the world are spiritual (angelic) not human (flesh and blood).



In our 2nd Reading, Paul asserts, "Do not lose heart…, this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure" (2Cor 4:17).

Jesus, our Brother, our Savior, is a force of good and a witness to human solidarity. We are God's family; He is *Our Father*. For this Jesus died and rose.

When Jesus boldly names *the unpardonable sin*, it's the Sin Against the Holy Ghost. What does he mean? St. Mark explains, it's blasphemy against the Holy Spirit to say, 'He has an unclean spirit' (3:30).

St. John Paul II in his letter about the Holy Spirit said this blasphemy is not about offensive words but a refusal to accept the Spirit's gift of enlightening consciences—to see the need for salvation and God's free offer of forgiveness (*Dominum et Vivificantem*, 45-46).

The blasphemy lies in believing *I don't need forgiven*. A hint that we toy with this sin is when we heap guilt upon our flesh-&-blood-neighbors and write them off as evil. Often, when we label our opponents (a person, a regime, a nation, etc.) 'evil', we dodge the real spiritual combat and the responsibility we have to stand up for one another as human beings, fellow brothers and sisters in the battle for salvation. Name calling, false labeling, gets a harsh rebuke from Jesus (Mt 5:22), likened to murder.

Jesus' wisdom is to show us that we are all of one House, the Father's. We help him build it when we show our neighbor mercy, when we love even our enemies, when we stand for the solidarity of the human race—united in the Blood of Christ.

From the Catholic Rural Life Prayer Book:

A Blessing of Bees

- **V**. Our help is in the name of the Lord.
- **R**. Who has made heaven and earth.
- **¥.** The Lord be with you.
- **R**,. And with your spirit.

Let us pray.

Lord God almighty, You have created heaven and earth, and all the animals existing on the earth and in the earth and the air, that men might make use of them. You have also directed that the priests of Your holy Church should in the House of God light candles made of the work of bees while that sacred ministry is being performed in which the most holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, Your Son, becomes present and is consumed. May Your blessing come down upon these bees and these beehives. May they multiply and be fruitful and be preserved from all evils, so that the product which comes from them may be used to praise You, Your Son, and the Holy Spir-

it, and the most blessed Virgin Mary, through the same Christ our Lord. **R. Amen.** (And they are sprinkled with holy water.)


ATTENTION ALL ALTAR SERVERS!
